Dear Supervisors:

Today an ordinance declaring Humboldt County a Sanctuary County comes before you. This ordinance has received sufficient signatures to qualify as a ballot measure in the November election. It is my understanding that you have two choices. You can adopt the ordinance as it is written, or you must refer it to appear on the ballot in November. It is unfortunate that our Initiative Process limits your options.

If you choose to accept it today, or if a majority of the voters approve it, you will be faced with implementing this ordinance. One of my concerns is with the section of the ordinance that addresses the role of the Humboldt County Human Rights Commission, and I quote:

“ENFORCEMENT

The Human Rights Commission shall review the compliance of the County departments, agencies, commissions, and employees with the mandates of this ordinance in particular instances in which there is question of noncompliance or when a complaint alleging noncompliance has been lodged. The Commission will inform the agency being complained of and shall allow for comments and materials from all parties named in the complaint. A written report with the Commission’s findings shall be submitted to the Board of Supervisors within sixty (60) days after the first meeting following the submission of a complaint.”

The Human Rights Commission is made up of volunteers. It has no budget from the county, and receives no staff support from the county. Its meeting times are limited to two hours once a month. It is very possible that the Commission would need to schedule more meetings to accommodate “comments and materials from all parties,” and a written report for each incidence would put an additional strain on the time and energy of the volunteers.

I hope the the Supervisors are prepared to allocate additional resources to the Human Rights Commission, both financial and personnel, if this ordinance becomes law in the county.

I would like to emphasize that I am speaking as a private citizen today, not as a commissioner. The Human Rights Commission, to date, has not taken a position on this ordinance. Thank you for listening to my concerns.
