## **PROCLAMATION**

## OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS COUNTY OF HUMBOLDT

WHEREAS, the theme of National Alcohol Awareness Month this year is "Help for Today, Hope for Tomorrow"; and

**WHEREAS,** the National Council on Alcoholism and Drug Dependence sponsors this observance to remind Americans that alcohol is the most commonly used addictive substance in the United States; and

**WHEREAS**, one in every 12 adults suffers from alcohol abuse or dependence; and over 100,000 persons die each year from alcohol-related causes: drinking and driving crashes, other accidents, falls, fires, alcohol-related homicides and suicides; and

**WHEREAS,** young people who begin drinking before age 15 are four times more likely to develop alcohol dependence than those who begin drinking at age 21; and

**WHEREAS,** a number of organizations work in treatment, prevention and law enforcement to lower the negative impact of alcohol abuse in Humboldt County; and

**WHEREAS**, a number of people are committed to recovery in self-help groups and organizations, such as Alcoholics Anonymous; and

**WHEREAS,** volunteers with groups like the Behavioral Health Board and Allies for Substance Abuse Prevention support efforts to reduce stigma, increase community awareness and to support individuals and families coping with alcoholism.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Humboldt do hereby proclaim that April 2014 is Alcohol Awareness Month in Humboldt County. Together, we can provide "Help for Today, Hope for Tomorrow" for those in our community who are facing challenges with alcohol abuse and addiction.
