

Kelly & Shelby Patton urge you to join us in standing up for landowner rights in the County of Humboldt. Recent actions by the County & the Great Redwood Trail attempt to target landowners serves as a stark reminder that our freedoms can be eroded if we remain silent. If authorities can infringe upon the rights of some, they can do it to anyone—perhaps even you.

Landownership is not only a personal investment but a cornerstone of our communities and a symbol of independence. We pay property taxes to support local services and infrastructure, but these taxes should not come at the cost of our rights. We must protect our right to manage our properties as we see fit, free from undue intrusion, harassment & intimidation.

We do not discount that there are vested interests in riverfront properties, which Steve Madrone has obviously influenced decisions regarding the Great Redwood Trail's alignment and accessibility with his position as 5th district Humboldt County Board of Supervisor & Vice Chair position on the Great Redwood Trail board. The stakeholders argue that while the development could enhance river access and tourism, it is crucial to ensure that all decisions are made in the public's best interest which includes private property landowner's rights. This situation underscores the need for transparency and rigorous conflict-of-interest policies to maintain public trust in local government.

Let us come together to uphold these rights, ensuring that every landowner can enjoy the security and autonomy that land ownership brings. Our voices are powerful. If we do not stand united, we risk losing the very liberties we rely on.

We are requesting that the County vacate Fisher Road in Hydesville and put their time, money & efforts towards other river and wildlife access points that are in danger of being lost due to ill repair. The County, State and Federal Government authorities all had the chance to protect this cherished access to the Van Duzen River and they were negligent to not take our concerns seriously.
