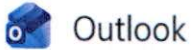

Dear Supervisor Arroyo,

I am writing to you today from our home in Northtown, Arcata, in support of a strong climate action plan for our county.

I understand that the proposed Regional Climate Action Plan was recently altered in a way that weakens the plan. I urge you to adopt the RCAP in its original, stronger form and to please do so without delay. Specifically, I believe that the CEQA significance thresholds for greenhouse gases should be set at the original values recommended by the county consultants who provided analyses for the RCAP.

Also, I urge you to support the Assembly (AB 1242) and Senate (SB 684) bills in the CA Legislature informally known as "Make Polluters Pay" that did not make it through regular legislative session this autumn and therefore must be passed in January if they are to survive.

My wife and I have spent some time in Sacramento volunteering to get these bills passed and we really would like to see the Humboldt Board of Supervisors put what weight they have behind getting a version of these bills made into law. These bills are modeled on the venerable federal "Superfund" site model in which polluters are required pay to clean their pollution. In the case of our global warming emergency, the polluters we are focused on are the fossil fuel manufacturers who have generated approximately 80% of the excess greenhouse gases that have polluted our atmosphere and will remain there for thousands of years. These GHGs are causing sea level rise and more severe wildfires, which are harms that directly impact us here in Humboldt County. AB 1242 (and companions bill SB 684) requires they pay part of the costs of adapting to the impacts of global warming here in California.

I urge you to take action on both the local RCAP and on the state-level AB 1242 bill.

Dear Supervisor Madrone,

We ask that you approve the Regional Climate Action Plan, after making a few key changes. Here are our specific requests:

- Adopt greenhouse gas thresholds at the original levels recommended by the consultant, and reject the Planning Commission's attempt to weaken this key standard for projects that aren't compliant with the plan. ([Check out EPIC's great explanation of this issue here.](#))
- Please revert the CEQA GHG thresholds of significance to the original level analyzed and recommended by the RCAP consultants.
- Ensure that only low-emission infill development projects will be considered compliant with the plan, so that high-emission rural developments aren't exempted from analyzing and mitigating their climate impacts.
- Adopt and implement the plan without delay and without weakening it

We have waited 8 years for a regional Climate Action Plan that addresses rising global climate pollution and the impacts of severe climate changes.
