## Humboldt County Board of Supervisors **PROCLAMATION** *in honor of*

## **Elder Abuse Awareness Month**

WHEREAS, the U.S. Census Bureau HAS estimated that nearly 26% of the population of Humboldt County is 60 years old or older; and

WHEREAS, throughout the U.S., elder abuse is widespread and significantly unrecognized, underreported and under prosecuted; and

WHEREAS, Humboldt County Department of Health & Human Services, Adult Protective Services (APS) receives an average of 118 reports of elder and vulnerable adult abuse and neglect monthly; and

WHEREAS, elders deserve respect and gratitude for their life-long contributions and the roles they play in their families and communities, including the preservation of customs, traditions and the history of Humboldt County; and

WHEREAS, elder abuse and neglect negatively impact an elder's emotional and physical health, and can result in isolation and the loss of independence, resources and/or life; and

WHEREAS, APS is committed to responding to and investigating allegations of elder and vulnerable adult abuse, regardless of the elder's education, socioeconomic standing, ethnic background or sexual orientation, and providing time-limited case management, emergency shelter and tangible resources, as well as participating in multidisciplinary personnel teams, as appropriate; and WHEREAS, APS works with the District Attorney's Office, law enforcement and other service providers by participating in a coordinated response and organizing local trainings to strengthen collective knowledge of abuse and neglect, improve communication and enhance elder abuse investigations and case review; and

WHEREAS, Humboldt County is committed to working with community partners and local Tribes on prevention and service coordination, including adapting emergency response procedures as needed and conducting additional outreach to ensure the safety and well-being of our elders and vulnerable adults.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors proclaims June 2025 as "Elder Abuse Awareness Month" and recognizes that elders are valuable members of society who have the right to live safely and securely in our community.
