DISCUSSION:

This project consists of repairing the Larabee Low Level Bridge (4C-171) which is currently closed to all traffic for safety reasons. The low level bridge serves the community of Larabee and provides access to timber and agriculture lands during the low flows of the Eel River, or approximately seven to eight months of the year. Currently, a temporary bridge is installed down-stream each spring and then removed in the fall by county road crews. Repairing the low level bridge will negate the need to install the temporary bridge and reduce operating costs. In addition to this repair project, funding for design and environmental studies for a new high level bridge to replace the low level bridge has been approved by the state. This project will maintain access for the community for the number of years it will take until the new high level bridge is constructed.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

There is no financial commitment until the project is awarded. This project is being funded through the Federal Transportation Improvement Program, BPMP which provides 88.53 percent of the funds for the project. The Road Fund will cover the remaining 11.47 percent of the project costs. The engineer's estimate for the construction contract is \$540,000. Construction costs were included in the FY 2015-16 Road Fund budget.

This project conforms to the Board of Supervisors' Core Role of providing and maintaining infrastructure as identified in the Board's Strategic Framework for 2015.

ALTERNATIVES TO STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

Not approve this project; however, staff does not recommend this alternative as this project will reopen the bridge that serves the Larabee community.
