**POST-ADOPTION SUMMARY OF URGENCY ORDINANCE EXTENDING A TEMPORARY MORATORIUM ON THE CULTIVATION OF INDUSTRIAL HEMP BY "ESTABLISHED AGRICULTURAL RESEARCH INSTITUTIONS" OR OTHERS WITHIN THE UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF THE COUNTY, WHICH SHALL TAKE IMMEDIATE EFFECT**

On Tuesday, May 14, 2019, during its regularly scheduled Board meeting, the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors adopted Ordinance \_\_\_\_\_ which extends urgency Ordinance No. 2624 to continue a temporary moratorium on the cultivation of industrial hemp as otherwise provided by California Food and Agriculture Code sections 81000 – 81011 by “established agricultural research institutions” or others within the unincorporated area of the County of Humboldt. The moratorium extension is in effect for six months after enactment, and may be extended by further action by the Board of Supervisors within that time period for a total of up to two years. A four-fifths vote is required for adoption of any extension.
