

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF HUMBOLDT AMENDING SECTION 228-4, OF THE HUMBOLDT COUNTY CODE CHANGING MEMBERSHIP OF THE HUMBOLDT COUNTY COMMISSION ON HUMAN RIGHTS.


The Board of Supervisors of the County of Humboldt ordains as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 228-4 of the Humboldt County Code is hereby amended as shown on the attached page 41.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty(30) days from the date of its passage. A summary shall be published at least five (5) days before the date set for adoption and again fifteen (15) days after passage of this ordinance. It shall be published once with the names of the Board of Supervisors voting for and against the ordinance in a newspaper of general circulation published in the County of Humboldt, State of California.



CHAPTER 8

HUMBOLDT COUNTY COMMISSION ON HUMAN RIGHTS

228-1. ESTABLISHMENT OF COMMISSION.

The Humboldt County Commission on Human Rights is hereby established. (Ord. 1023, § 1, 4/22/75)

228-2. AUTHORITY FOR ESTABLISHMENT.

The Commission is established pursuant to Title 5, Division 1, Part 1, Chapter 1, Article 10 of the Government Code (§§ 50260-50265) and § 31000.1 of the Government Code. (Ord. 1023 § 2, 4/22/75)

228-3. PURPOSE OF COMMISSION.

The Commission is established to aid in the eradication of discrimination in Humboldt County, with particular reference to housing, employment, education and public accommodation. The Board of Supervisors recognizes that such discrimination is harmful to those discriminated against and is ultimately harmful to the County, as a whole, due to the lack of utilization of the human potential of those subject to such discrimination, and further due to depreciated property values and the increased cost of governmental services such as law enforcement and welfare. Committees may be established by the Commission. (Ord. 1023, § 5, 4/22/75)

228-4. APPOINTMENT OF MEMBERS OF COMMISSION.

The Commission shall consist of fifteen (15) members who shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors. The Supervisors of each district shall appoint three (3) members. All appointments shall be for a term of four (4) years and shall expire on June 30 of the fourth year after the appointment. Members of the Commission shall serve at the pleasure of the Board of Supervisors. (Ord. 1023 § 3, 4/22/75; amended by Ord. 1444, § 4, 1/13/81; amended by Ord. Sec. / /98)

228-5. OFFICERS AND THEIR DUTIES.

The members of the Commission shall select a Chairman, a Vice Chairman and a Secretary. The Chairman shall preside at all meetings and shall
