That the Board of Supervisors adopt Ordinance No. 250 adding Chapter 1 (Partnership HealthPlan of California Commission), Title V (Health and Safety), Division 9 (Health Care), to the Humboldt County Code.

SOURCE OF FUNDING: Federal and State Medi-Cal dollars

<u>DISCUSSION</u>: As part of the 2012/13 state budget, the State of California authorized expansion of Medi-Cal managed care into the twenty-eight rural counties that currently provide Medi-Cal benefits on a fee-for-service basis only. The California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) intends all Medi-Cal benefits will be provided by a managed care entity beginning June 1, 2013.

On August 21, 2012, the Board approved a Resolution (Attachment 1) affirming its support for a regional County Organized Health System (COHS) model of Medi-Cal managed care for Humboldt County. The COHS model has been shown to be an effective Medi-Cal managed care model for improving patient health care outcomes for Medi-Cal recipients, with a focus on prevention and primary care, and allows for local representation in its governance structure.

On January 29, 2013, the Board approved a letter (Attachment 2) to California Health and Human Services

Agency Secretary Diana Dooley reiterating support for a County Organized Health System model of Medical managed care.

On February 27, 2013, the California Department of Health Care Services announced that Medi-Cal benefits in Humboldt County would be provided by Partnership HealthPlan of California, an existing County Organized Health System.

On April 23, 2013, the Board of Supervisors introduced the above ordinance (Attachment 3) for adoption and directed the Clerk of the Board to publish a pre-adoption summary of the ordinance and set the ordinance for adoption at least one week away. This action completes adoption of the ordinance and will result in publication of a post-adoption summary.

<u>FINANCIAL IMPACT</u>: There is no additional financial impact to the County General Fund associated with the recommendation before your Board. This action supports the Board's strategic framework by protecting vulnerable populations and creating opportunities for improved safety and health.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT: Clinics, hospitals and other Medi-Cal health care providers

<u>ALTERNATIVES TO STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS</u>: The Board could elect not to approve this action. This is not recommended as the ordinance is required to implement a County Organized Health System model of Medi-Cal managed care in Humboldt County.

DISCUSSION: As part of the 2012/13 state budget, the State of California is expanding Medi-Cal managed care into the twenty-eight rural counties that currently provide Medi-Cal benefits on a fee-for-service basis only. The California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) intends all Medi-Cal benefits will be provided by a managed care entity beginning June 1, 2013. DHCS is planning to release a Request for Applications (RFA) on September 1, 2012. Six other Northern California counties: Del Norte, Lassen, Modoc, Shasta, Siskiyou, and Trinity have requested to be excluded from the RFA to instead join Partnership HealthPlan of California (PHC), an existing regional County Organized Health System (COHS) to administer managed care Medi-Cal benefits. The DHCS has already given authorization for Lake County to join Solano, Napa, Yolo, Sonoma, Marin and Mendocino Counties in PHC.

The fast pace of the State's process to shift Medi-Cal to a managed care system has not allowed for the benefit of a full scope local stakeholder process. However, local Medi-Cal providers and community organizations that serve Medi-Cal recipients held a meeting June 14, 2012 to discuss Medi-Cal managed care and the COHS model. Following that meeting, the Department of Health and Human Services met with representatives of Partnership HealthPlan.

The North Coast Clinics Network, the primary provider for approximately 60% of all Humboldt County Medi-Cal patients as well as more than 13,000 self-pay patients in 2011 and 86% of all County Medical Services Program (CMSP) patients in Humboldt County who will be newly eligible for Medi-Cal in 2014, has stated a clear preference for PHC. The Hospital Council of Northern and Central California representing Humboldt County's four hospitals, St Joseph Hospital, Mad River Hospital, Jerald Phelps Community Hospital and Redwood Memorial Hospital, has also taken a position in support of excluding Humboldt County and the six other Northern California counties from the RFA to instead join PHC.

The COHS model has been shown to be an effective Medi-Cal managed care model for improving patient health care outcomes for Medi-Cal recipients, with a focus on prevention and primary care, and allows for local representation in its governance structure.

Having support from the medical providers serving the majority of Medi-Cal patients in the county, Assemblymember Chesbro, joined by Assemblymembers Neilsen and LaMalfa, has been advocating to DHCS that Humboldt County be removed from the RFA to pursue a COHS instead. Assemblymember Chesbro's office has requested a Resolution from the Board affirming the County's support for a COHS.

This Resolution affirms the County's preference for Medi-Cal managed care benefits to be delivered by a County Organized Health System.

## A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF HUMBOLDT

WHEREAS, the number of Humboldt County residents enrolled in Medi-Cal exceeds 27,000 and the Medi-cal program supports the healthcare needs of low income, aged, blind and disabled residents; the current system of unmanaged fee-for-service healthcare delivery increases the overall costs of the Medi-Cal program, and is not as efficient with taxpayer dollars as managed care Medi-Cal where health care is coordinated between providers, and primary care and preventive services are emphasized; and

WHEREAS, the State of California is expanding Medi-Cal managed care into the 28 rural counties that are now fee-for-service only; and the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) has indicated that the expansion of Medi-Cal managed care will likely be accomplished through a competitive bidding process; and

WHEREAS, the County Organized Health System (COHS) model of managed care has been shown to be an effective Medi-Cal managed care model for improving patient health care outcomes for Medi-Cal recipients, with a focus on prevention and primary care, and allows for local representation in its governance structure; and

WHEREAS, Partnership HealthPlan of California (PHC) is a managed care organization with significant experience with the Medi-Cal populations in Solano, Napa, Yolo, Sonoma, Marin and Mendocino counties; and has committed to work with Humboldt County (and six other contiguous fee-for-service northern California counties) in providing managed care services to our Medi-Cal beneficiaries through the COHS model; and

WHEREAS, Humboldt County Medi-Cal recipients can benefit from the expansion of a COHS into the County, improving access to care and expected health outcomes, should the State of California and PHC agree upon the terms of such an expansion; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors hereby resolves that improved patient health outcomes at less cost to the taxpayer should be the main purpose of adopting a managed care model for Medi-Cal in Humboldt County; and anticipates that the State of California will support the recommendations of the elected representatives of Humboldt County when deciding how to organize Medi-Cal managed care within Humboldt County; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors hereby affirms its support for a COHS model of Medi-Cal managed care for Humboldt County and authorizes the Department of Health and Human Services to work with the DHCS, PHC and local health care stakeholders to ensure the most effective transition possible.

Dear Secretary Dooley,

As you know, seven of the rural counties (Del Norte, Siskiyou, Modoc, Humboldt, Trinity, Shasta and Lassen) have been demanding that a COHS single- plan model of health care delivery be adopted for the group. Since we originally met, ALL seven boards of supervisors have adopted resolutions that support a COHS model. The medical providers in the area have sent letters to DHCS expressing their strong support for the adoption of a COHS model. In fact, those same providers signed letters of intent to become part of a COHS provider network and stakeholders have actively participated and provided clear feedback at meetings held by DHCS. At the most recent meeting in Anderson, seventy-five people attended to express their strong support for a COHS model and to make it absolutely clear that they strongly disagree with inclusion of the seven counties in the RFA for a geographic or two-plan managed care plan.

During our discussions and in our letters, we were assured that DHCS was actively considering a COHS model for the rural expansion. However, we are feeling the original commitment to give preferential treatment to the COHS Model is not being fully honored. The stakeholders in seven countles have expressed time and again their willingness to work with DHCS to bring Medi-Cal managed care in the form of a COHS model to the northern rural region yet DHCS has not yet allowed them to move forward. It is our understanding that other countles such as San Benito and Mariposa have not faced similar barriers as they work toward joining a COHS.

We are asking once again that the seven counties be removed from the RFA process and allowed to move forward with plans for a County Organized Health System.

**RESOLUTION NO. 12-70** 

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF HUMBOLDT AFFIRMING ITS SUPPORT FOR A REGIONAL COUNTY ORGANIZED HEALTH SYSTEM MODEL OF MEDI-CAL MANAGED CARE FOR HUMBOLDT COUNTY.

WHEREAS, the number of Humboldt County residents enrolled in Medi-Cal exceeds 27,000 and the Medi-cal program supports the healthcare needs of low income, aged, blind and disabled residents; the current system of unmanaged fee-for-service healthcare delivery increases the overall costs of the Medi-Cal program, and is not as efficient with taxpayer dollars as managed care Medi-Cal where health care is coordinated between providers, and primary care and preventive services are emphasized; and

WHEREAS, the State of California is expanding Medi-Cal managed care into the 28 rural counties that are now fee-for-service only; and the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) has indicated that the expansion of Medi-Cal managed care will likely be accomplished through a competitive bidding process; and

WHEREAS, the County Organized Health System (COHS) model of managed care has been shown to be an effective Medi-Cal managed care model for improving patient health care outcomes for Medi-Cal recipients, with a focus on prevention and primary care, and allows for local representation in its governance structure; and

WHEREAS, Partnership HealthPlan of California (PHC) is a managed care organization with significant experience with the Medi-Cal populations in Solano, Napa, Yolo, Sonoma, Marin and Mendocino counties; and has committed to work with Humboldt County (and six other contiguous fee-for-service northern California counties) in providing managed care services to our Medi-Cal beneficiaries through the COHS model; and

WHEREAS, Humboldt County Medi-Cal recipients can benefit from the expansion of a COHS into the County, improving access to care and expected health outcomes, should the State of California and PHC agree upon the terms of such an expansion; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors hereby resolves that improved patient health outcomes at less cost to the taxpayer should be the main purpose of adopting a managed care model for Medi-Cal in Humboldt County; and anticipates that the State of California will support the recommendations of the elected representatives of Humboldt County when deciding how to organize Medi-Cal managed care within Humboldt County; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors hereby affirms its support for a COHS model of Medi-Cal managed care for Humboldt County and authorizes the Department of Health and Human Services to work with the DHCS, PHC and local health care stakeholders to ensure the most effective transition possible.

#### DISCUSSION:

As part of the 2012/13 state budget, the State of California authorized expansion of Medi-Cal managed care into the twenty-eight rural counties that currently provide Medi-Cal benefits on a fee-for-service basis only. The California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) intends all Medi-Cal benefits will be provided by a managed care entity beginning June 1, 2013.

On August 21, 2012, the Board approved a Resolution (Attachment 1) affirming its support for a regional County Organized Health System (COHS) model of Medi-Cal managed care for Humboldt County. The COHS model has been shown to be an effective Medi-Cal managed care model for improving patient health care outcomes for Medi-Cal recipients, with a focus on prevention and primary care, and allows for local representation in its governance structure.

On January 29, 2013, the Board approved a letter (Attachment 2) to California Health and Human Services Agency Secretary Diana Dooley reiterating support for a County Organized Health System model of Medical managed care.

On February 27, 2013, the California Department of Health Care Services announced that Medi-Cal benefits in Humboldt County would be provided by Partnership HealthPlan of California, an existing County Organized Health System.

Partnership HealthPlan of California is governed by a Board of Commissioners, appointed by the Boards of Supervisors in the counties in which it operates. This ordinance is necessary to enact local representation on the Commission.

<u>FINANCIAL IMPACT</u>: There is no additional financial impact to the County General Fund associated with the recommendation before your Board. This action supports the Board's strategic framework by protecting vulnerable populations and creating opportunities for improved safety and health.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT: Clinics, hospitals and other Medi-Cal health care providers

<u>ALTERNATIVES TO STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS</u>: The Board could elect not to approve this action. This is not recommended as the ordinance is required to implement a County Organized Health System model of Medi-Cal managed care in Humboldt County.

SECTION 1. Sections 591-1 through 591-9 of Chapter 1 of Division 9 of Title V of the Humboldt County Code are added as shown on the attached pages.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days from the date of its passage. A summary shall be published at least five (5) days before the date set for adoption and again fifteen (15) days after passage of this ordinance. It shall be published once with the names of the Board of Supervisors voting for and against the

ordinance in a newspaper of general circulation published in the County of Humboldt, State of California.

#### PARTNERSHIP HEALTHPLAN OF CALIFORNIA COMMISSION

#### CHAPTER 1

#### 591-1. INTENT.

Partnership HealthPlan of California Commission ("commission") is a multi-county commission that has created a managed health care plan for Medi-Cal recipients. The purpose of this chapter is to authorize the County of Humboldt to join the existing commission. This will allow the implementation of a county organized health system in Humboldt County as authorized by Welfare and Institutions Code § 14087.54. (Ord. \_\_\_\_, § \_\_, \_\_/\_\_/2013)

The commission has a proven record of improving health care access to its members, who are Medi-Cal recipients, and improving Medi-Cal reimbursement rates to health care providers. The commission links each member with a primary care provider and has been successful in reducing inappropriate use of emergency rooms, providing appropriate levels of inpatient care for its members, developing innovative case management programs and arranging for the provision of an enhanced level of local health care services. (Ord. \_\_\_, § \_\_, \_/\_\_/2013)

The commission will negotiate an exclusive contract with the California Department of Health Care Services authorizing the expansion of the Partnership HealthPlan of California into Humboldt County. This expansion is expected to occur on or about June 1, 2013. (ord. \_\_\_, \$ \_\_, \_/\_/2013)

#### 591-2. AUTHORIZATION TO JOIN COMMISSION.

Pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code § 14087.54, the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the County of Humboldt to join the commission. (Ord. \_\_\_, § \_\_, \_\_/\_\_/2013)

#### 591-3. MEMBERSHIP OF COMMISSION.

Commission representation shall be based on the number of Medi-Cal beneficiaries enrolled in the HealthPlan in each county as follows: one commissioner per zero to ten thousand beneficiaries; two commissioners per ten thousand to twenty-five thousand beneficiaries; three commissioners per twenty-five thousand to forty thousand beneficiaries; and four commissioners per more than forty thousand beneficiaries. (Ord. \_\_\_\_, § \_\_, \_\_/\_/2013)

- (1) One member shall be the Director of Health and Human Services or Director's designee. (Ord. \_\_\_,  $\S$  \_, \_/\_/2013)
- (2) Additional members will be nominated by local health care providers that serve Medi-Cal beneficiaries. (Ord. \_\_\_\_, § \_\_, \_/\_/2013)

The Director of Health and Human Services will receive and evaluate nominations and make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors. (ord. \_\_\_, § \_\_, \_\_/\_\_/2013)

#### 591-4. TERM OF OFFICE.

The term for the commissioners shall be for four-year periods. Nothing herein shall prohibit a person from serving more than one term. Each commission member shall remain in office at the conclusion of that member's term until a successor member has been selected and installed into office. An office shall become vacant if a board member discontinues to function in the area from which appointed, or fails to attend three meetings in a row of the commission. (Ord. \_\_\_, s\_\_, \_/\_\_/2013)

#### 591-5. POWERS AND DUTIES OF COMMISSION.

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 14087.54 of the Welfare and Institutions Code as it exists on the date of adoption of this ordinance, the commission shall: (ord. \_\_\_, § \_\_, \_\_/\_\_/2013)

- A. Have the power to negotiate the exclusive contract with the California State Department of Health Care Services as specified in Section 14087.5 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, and to arrange for the provision of health care services provided under Chapter 7, Part 3, Division 9 of the Welfare and Institutions Code; (ord. \_\_\_\_, § \_\_, \_\_/\_\_/2013)
- B. Be considered an entity separate from the County of Humboldt; (Ord. \_\_\_, § \_\_, \_/\_/2013)
- C. File the statement required by Section 53051 of the Government Code; (Ord. \_\_\_,  $\S$  \_\_, \_\_/\_/2013)
- D. Have the power to acquire, possess, and dispose of real or personal property, as may be necessary for the performance of its functions, to employ personnel and contract for services required to meet its obligations, and to sue or be sued; and (ord. \_\_\_,  $\S$ \_\_, \_/\_/2013)
- E. Have all the rights, powers, duties, privileges, and immunities conferred by Article 2.8 of Chapter 7, Part 3, Division 9 of the Welfare and Institutions Code in addition to those previously specified in this section. (Ord. \_\_\_\_, § \_\_, \_\_/\_\_/2013)

#### 591-6. OBLIGATIONS OF COMMISSION.

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 14087.54(d) of the Welfare and Institutions Code as it exists on the date of adoption of the ordinance codified in this chapter, any obligations of the commission, statutory, contractual, or otherwise, shall be the obligations solely of the commission and shall not be the obligations of the County of Humboldt. The commission shall do business as the Partnership HealthPlan of California. (Ord. \_\_\_, s \_\_, \_/\_/2013)

#### 591-7. COMMITTEES.

The commission may establish advisory committees from time to time for any purpose that will be beneficial in accomplishing the work of the commission. (Ord. \_\_\_, § \_\_, \_\_/\_/2013)

#### 591-8. TERMINATION OF MEMBERRSHIP.

The commission shall continue to represent Humboldt County until such time as the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors terminates the representation. To terminate the representation, the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors or its designee shall provide ninety-day notice to other participating counties and the state Department of Health Care Services, as specified in Welfare and Institutions Code § 14087.54(g). (Ord. \_\_\_, § \_, \_/\_\_/2013)

#### 591-9. SEVERABILITY.

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of the ordinance. The Board of Supervisors hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance and every section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that one or more section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase be declared unconstitutional or invalid. (Ord. \_\_\_, § \_\_, \_/\_/2013)
