RE: Support for SB 1212, regarding 2-1-1 Disaster Preparedness, Response, and Recovery

Dear Senator Hueso:

On behalf of the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors, I am writing in support of your SB 1212. We thank you for your leadership on this issue and your understanding of the critical need for all areas of the state to be connected with vital services in times of a disaster.

As you know, the 2-1-1 Information and Referral network connects people with local services that addresses needs, such as food insecurity, housing resource instability, and mental health. During an emergency, 2-1-1 also provides important information regarding evacuations, return routes, access to basic needs like food and water, assistance with rumor control, shelter availability, traffic closures and more. This information is provided in a local and meaningful way, as well as being available in over 150 different languages.

In addition to providing direct assistance to callers, the 2-1-1 disaster response network has helped leverage public safety resources by reducing the number of nonemergency calls to 911, freeing up emergency responders to then respond to true life-or-death situations.

While the benefits of 2-1-1 during a disaster are numerous, there are unfortunately still areas in the state that remains unconnected to this critical service. Specifically, 21 counties located in some of the most rural areas of the state do not have a 2-1-1 connection, which leaves them lacking in information and potentially access to local services during an emergency when their need is the highest.

It is imperative that the state invest in ensuring that all residents have access to information and assistance during times of disaster. Your SB 1212 is an important step in achieving this goal. We look forward to working with you and your Senate colleagues to ensure passage of this legislation.
