Describe how the scope of your proposal fits the intent of Measure Z. Specifically, how will it maintain and improve public safety and essential services?*

Wild Souls Ranch's First Responder Pilot Program improves public safety and essential services by providing mental health support services for local first responders through our Equine Assisted Growth and Learning sessions. Equine Assisted Growth and Learning (EAGL) is a non-traditional, therapeutic model that involves collaboration between a client and their equine counterpart with support from a mental health case worker, and an equine specialist to address a wide range of issues, including improved communication and social skills, development of healthy relationships, learning how to set boundaries, and increased confidence and self-esteem. Horses provide a safe, non-judgmental space for emotional exploration, allowing clients to process and evaluate traumatic events that have occurred in both their personal and work lives. Horses can become a powerful metaphor that allows clients to receive immediate, in-the-moment feedback.

Our First Responder Pilot Program can provide critical mental health support to law enforcement, firefighters, EMTs, and other emergency personnel, helping them manage job-related stress, PTSD, and burnout. By fostering resilience, emotional regulation, and teamwork, we will improve their long-term well-being and, in turn, their effectiveness in serving our Humboldt County community. Measure Z funding will allow us to expand these essential services, ensuring that first responders receive the support they need. One example of this would be our enhanced ability to travel to different locations around the county aside from our ranch's location in Fortuna, such as Lazy L Ranch in Arcata and the Orick Rodeo Grounds, to meet with first responders from northern Humboldt County. By investing in innovative mental health solutions, we will strengthen the community's overall resilience and reinforce the critical services that uphold public safety.

Please provide a brief description of the proposal for which you are seeking funding.*

Wild Souls Ranch's First Responder Pilot Program utilizes EAGL to address the critical mental health needs of emergency personnel in Humboldt County that are currently not being met due to our limited health infrastructure. This innovative approach provides an alternative to traditional talk therapy, helping first responders such as law enforcement, firefighters, EMTs, and dispatchers manage job-related stress, PTSD, and emotional challenges. Through staff-guided sessions with our horses, participants develop resilience, emotional regulation, and teamwork skills, all within a safe, non-judgmental environment. We aim to serve up to 50 first responders across over 300 sessions within one year of receiving funding.

In 2024, we ran the first pilot program with members of the Fortuna Police Department and demonstrated measurable reductions in depression, anxiety, and anger over six months, showcasing its effectiveness in improving mental resilience. With a long-term vision to expand services to a broader range of first responders and military personnel, Wild Souls Ranch aims to become a regional leader in mental health support. By providing a unique therapeutic experience that fosters self-awareness and problem-solving, the program not only benefits individuals but also strengthens public service member retention and overall community well-being. Wild Souls Ranch's ability to travel ensures accessibility throughout Humboldt County, making this initiative a vital resource for those who dedicate their lives to keeping the community safe.

How have you developed a plan for sustainability, including diversification of funding sources, for your proposal to carry on without reliance on future Measure Z funds? Please provide detail of your plan for sustainability here.*

Wild Souls Ranch has developed a comprehensive sustainability plan to ensure long-term program success without future reliance on Measure Z funds. Our funding strategy includes diversifying revenue streams through private donations, grants, corporate sponsorships, and program fees. We are actively seeking partnerships with local businesses, philanthropic organizations, and government agencies to secure stable financial support. To further strengthen sustainability, Wild Souls Ranch is expanding its fundraising efforts through community events, donor campaigns, and sponsorship opportunities. We are also exploring collaborations with regional mental health organizations to explore the possibility of funding through healthcare reimbursement models in the future. These strategic initiatives ensure that our programs, including the First Responder Pilot Program, can continue serving the community without dependency on Measure Z funding, securing a lasting impact on public safety and mental health in Humboldt County.

If this request is for the continuation or expansion of an existing program/service, what is the current source of funding for that program/service?*

This pilot program does not currently receive funding. Wild Souls Ranch wanted to ensure that the modality would be effective before engaging in funding revenues. Once it was ensured that the program was a success, during our first trial with the Fortuna Police Department, the organization is now actively looking for funding to continue the work. If any first responders would currently like to participate in the program, they can pay for sessions themselves.

If you are awarded Measure Z funds, how do you plan to leverage these funds to secure additional grants, contributions or community support? *

If awarded Measure Z funds, Wild Souls Ranch will leverage this investment to secure additional grants, contributions, and donations from community members by demonstrating our success in mental health outcomes for first responders and being transparent with our results. With a proven track record of serving over 500 youth and positive pilot program results from 2024 with the Fortuna Police Department, Measure Z funds will strengthen our ability to seek outside funding sources focused on mental health and public safety. Additionally, the funding and partnerships with local first responder providers will help us expand partnerships with local businesses, nonprofit organizations, and private donors who are invested in community well-being.


By utilizing Measure Z funds to enhance and expand our first responder program, we will increase visibility and credibility, making Wild Souls Ranch a competitive candidate for long-term funding opportunities. We will actively engage with community stakeholders through outreach events, impact reports, and fundraising campaigns, ensuring continued financial sustainability and growth. This investment will allow us to establish Wild Souls Ranch as a regional leader in innovative mental health support for both children and emergency personnel, creating lasting benefits for Humboldt County.

This proposal will require collaboration with local law enforcement agencies and emergency response organizations to be fully functional and effective. Entities such as the Fortuna Police Department, Humboldt County Sheriff's Office, local fire departments, and emergency medical services will need to participate by referring first responders to the program and supporting its implementation.

Participation from these entities will include identifying eligible first responders, coordinating schedules for therapy sessions, and integrating the program into existing wellness initiatives. Law enforcement and emergency response leadership will also need to advocate for and encourage participation to ensure engagement and long-term success. This collaborative effort will expand the reach of mental health support, ultimately enhancing the well-being and effectiveness of first responders in Humboldt County.

All expenses associated with this application are recurring. The expenses submitted are based on the cost to facilitate 300 sessions, serving 50 first responders. This is the ongoing cost to support this program, and as detailed above, Wild Souls Ranch has several avenues to explore that will allow for continued program support and funding. With these recurring costs, Wild Souls Ranch is happy to accept any amount of funding from Measure Z that will help us support Humboldt County's First Responders.
