- I learned hard work can win
- Those in power may not come with an open-mind and are not always right.
- It may not always be smart to let minority opinion prevail.
- Working only with those who agree with you can lead to bad results.
- Those in the line of fire do not always get their due.
- Many experienced truths are not applied in a good smart way.
- The pen works better when the sword is not dull.
