

Subject: Letter of Support for AB 2142 (Chesbro) Extending AB 744 Pilot Project to Additional Areas of the State with High Fire Hazard Severity by adding, Del Norte, Humboldt, Mendocino and Sonoma Counties.

<u>DISCUSSION</u>: In 2013, the State Legislature passed AB 744 to evaluate the expansion of the Forest Fire Prevention Exemption (FFPE). This 3-year pilot project is designed to encourage landowners to conduct forest-thinning projects to reduce the occurrence of wildfires, mitigate the damage and improve overall forest health in the Sierra Nevada region in high and very high fire hazard severity zones. AB 2142 would extend AB 744 pilot project to additional areas of the state with high fire hazard severity by adding Del Norte, Humboldt, Mendocino and Sonoma Counties.



Subject: AB 2142 (Chesbro) - SUPPORT

Dear Assembly Member Chesbro:

On behalf of the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors, I am writing in full support of AB 2142, which would extend the AB 744 (Gordon & Dahle) pilot project to additional areas of the state with high fire hazard severity by adding Del Norte, Humboldt, Mendocino and Sonoma Counties.

Last year in response to the Rim Fire, which burned over 250,000 acres in and around Yosemite National Park, the legislature passed AB 744 to evaluate the expansion of the Forest Fire Prevention Exemption (FFPE). This 3-year pilot project is designed to encourage landowners to conduct forestthinning projects to reduce the occurrence of wildfires, mitigate the damage and improve overall forest. health in the Sierra Nevada region in high and very high fire hazard severity zones. While this bill represented an improvement in California's fire-prevention efforts, it did not apply to several areas of the state with significant fire hazard severity.

The addition of Del Norte, Humboldt, Mendocino and Sonoma Counties to the AB 744 pilot will create a more robust pilot project and will help policymakers evaluate an important means of addressing the drought and safeguarding our forests from the devastating impacts of wildfire on public health, water and wildlife in additional areas of the state that have been determined to be at significant risk of catastrophic wildfire.

California leaders must come together to advance economically feasible ways to reduce the growing threat of catastrophic wildfires from devastating our state's forestlands and waterways.

We urge your support for AB 2142, and thank you in advance for your consideration of this very important project.
