

WHEREAS, after serving honorably in the Army during the Vietnam War, Dave began working in the lumber industry for Eel River Saw Mills, where he excelled in a management position; and

immediately returned home to help his family and fellow residents in their recovery efforts as well as

document the devastation left by the flood; and

WHEREAS, in late 1980, Dave became interested in the newly acquired Holmgren Homestead near Miranda, and joined the Humboldt Redwood State Park Interpretive Association, dedicated to the mission of interpreting the redwoods to the public; and

WHEREAS, at age 55, Dave retired from the lumber business and made a career move. He accepted a position as Executive Director of the Visitor Center in Humboldt Redwoods State Park, and along with former District 2 Supervisors Harry Pritchard, and the HRIA Board was able to expand the size of the Visitor Center by adding a wing on the south side that doubled the size of the building, allowing for exhibits of stuffed birds and animals, and a multi-media room; and

WHEREAS, Dave has worked tirelessly with volunteers and State Park employees to share the unique aspects of the redwood region with millions of visitors. His knowledge of the redwoods and trail systems in the park is second to none. He knows where all the tallest and largest trees are located and has assisted instructors with scientific research, and Hollywood filmmakers with locations and technical assistance; and

WHEREAS, Dave co-authored two Arcadia Press history books; one titled "The 1964 Flood" and the other describing the unique history of the Humboldt Redwoods State Park area. He has been a member of the Redcrest Grange for most of his life and also served on the Fortuna Historical Commission for two terms; and

WHEREAS, after fifteen years of managing the Visitor Center, at age seventy, Dave decided to retire to spend more time with family but still remains as an active participant and member of the Board of Directors; and

WHEREAS, Dave's life represents the power of working as a volunteer and serving his community, and his greatest achievement remains his ability to work together with people from all walks of life to create positive change.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors, hereby commends and thanks Dave Stockton for his dedicated years of service to the citizens of Humboldt County and wish him a long, productive, well deserved retirement.
