## **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

This course is designed to equip dental professionals with the knowledge and tools needed to better serve older adult populations through innovative and collaborative approaches. Participants will examine disparities at the local, state, and national levels, and explore how emerging models of care—such as mobile dentistry, teledentistry, and community-based programs—can help reduce gaps in access and improve outcomes.

A key component of this program includes application of findings from A Healthy Smile Never Gets Old 2.0, a multi-sector initiative that identifies promising practices for advancing oral health access among older adults. Participants will evaluate how these findings can inform both clinical decision-making and policy advocacy. Additionally, the course will compare governmental strategies and highlight the importance of aligning oral health with broader aging services, housing supports, and social care systems.

This educational experience, involving experts from the local, state and national perspectives, supports providers in taking a leadership role to promote oral health equity, with a focus on interprofessional collaboration and systems-level thinking.
