On Tuesday, December 8, 2020, during its regularly scheduled Board meeting, the Humboldt
County Board of Supervisors adopted Ordinance which extends urgency Ordinance No.
2637 to continue a temporary moratorium on the cultivation of industrial hemp as otherwise
provided by California Food and Agriculture Code sections 81000 – 81011 by "established
agricultural research institutions" or others within the unincorporated area of the County of
Humboldt. The moratorium extension is in effect for four months and fifteen days after enactment and will expire on May 10, 2021.
