RECOMMENDATION(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Receive a report from Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) - Public Health; and
2. Authorize staff to draft a Tobacco Retail Licensing ordinance to be considered by the Board at a later date.

SOURCE OF FUNDING:

Public Health Funds (1175)

DISCUSSION:

In Humboldt County, tobacco smoking causes or contributes to 34% of all deaths. Humboldt County's DHHS - Public Health, Tobacco-Free Humboldt Program works to prevent tobacco use by providing community education and legal technical assistance to jurisdictions interested in pursuing policies that reduce exposure to secondhand smoke and reduce the availability of tobacco, especially among youth. Staff does this work together with the Tobacco Education Network, a community coalition, and other community partners with common goal of promoting health in our community. Currently a focus of this policy work is supporting healthy choices in the retail environment. A January 2022 survey of 37 tobacco retailers in county unincorporated areas resulted in an underage purchase rate of 54%. 60% of Humboldt ninth graders and 67% of eleventh graders report it is "fairly" or "very" easy to obtain vape (e-cigarette) products. Tobacco retail licensing (TRL) ordinances have been enacted in 219 jurisdictions in California. They enable jurisdictions to have local control over the types of tobacco products sold, the number of retailers, and their location. They are an effective tool to limit youth access to tobacco and reduce tobacco-related mortality. Program administration and enforcement are funded by licensing fees paid by tobacco retailers.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

There is no financial impact for receiving a report regarding tobacco retail licensing. Should an ordinance be authorized, ordinance administration would be self-funded from fees paid by retailers applying for licenses to sell tobacco. Retailer and community education funded by California Department of Public Health, California Tobacco Control Program administered by the Healthy Communities Division of DHHS - Public Health. RECOMMENDATION(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Introduce the attached Ordinance (Comprehensive Tobacco Retailer Licensing Ordinance; An Ordinance of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Humboldt Adding Chapter 7 to Title VII, Division 1 of the County Code "Tobacco Retailer Licensing" Regulating Tobacco Product Sales and Requiring the Licensure of Tobacco Retailers) and waive the first reading;
2. Set the Ordinance for adoption on July 1, 2023, to take effect and be in force 30 days from the date of its adoption;
3. Discuss the attached draft fee schedule for Department of Health and Human Services - Public Health Fund 1175, Budget Unit 411, to be brought back to your Board through a future public hearing;
4. Direct the Clerk of the Board to publish the required pre-adoption summary of the Ordinance to be done at least 5 days prior to the date set for adoption; and
5. Direct the Clerk of the Board within 15 days after the adoption of the Ordinance, to publish a post-adoption summary of the Ordinance with the names of the Supervisors voting for and against the Ordinance, in a newspaper of general circulation published in the County of Humboldt, State of California.

DISCUSSION:

Tobacco use is the number one cause of preventable death in California and continues to be an urgent public health issue. The State of California enacted SB 793 which took effect on Dec. 21, 2022, in response to the rising epidemic of youth usage of flavored tobacco products; the targeted marketing of

certain flavored tobacco products to communities of color, low-income individuals, and the LGBTQ community; and the aggressive marketing of menthol-flavored products to African American community members. The provisions within SB 793 do not preempt or prohibit the adoption of local standards, which would give greater local control over the sale of tobacco products in Humboldt County than the provisions of this bill.

In California, 219 cities and counties have passed tobacco retailer licensing ordinances to stop youth from using tobacco. In Humboldt County, smoking and lung cancer rates exceed those of the state. The high density of tobacco retailers is linked to high availability of tobacco products, increased smoking, and increased tobacco-related disease and death. A January 2022 survey of 37 tobacco retailers in county unincorporated areas revealed 54% sold tobacco to an underage youth as defined as someone under the current legal purchasing age of 21 years of age. Sixty percent of Humboldt ninth graders and 67% of 11th graders report it is “fairly” or “very” easy to obtain vape (e-cigarette) products.

Humboldt County Department of Health and Human Services - Public Health Branch (DHHS-PH), Healthy Communities and WIC Division is engaged in policy work to reduce exposure to secondhand smoke and reduce the availability of tobacco, especially among youth under 21 years of age. On Aug. 16, 2022, the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors received a report from DHHS-PH and authorized staff to draft a Tobacco Retail Licensing ordinance to be considered by the Board at a later date. DHHS -PH has drafted the attached Ordinance regulating tobacco product sales and requiring licensure of tobacco retailers.

Enacting the Ordinance will not unduly burden the legitimate business activities of retailers who sell tobacco products to adults. It is the intent of the Ordinance to ensure compliance with the business standards and practices of the county, encourage responsible tobacco retailing, and discourage violations of tobacco-related laws, especially those which prohibit or discourage the sale or distribution of tobacco products to youth.

Approval of the attached ordinance will not authorize to collect the attached fees. If the ordinance is adopted, DHHS-Public Health will return to your Board through a public hearing to approve and adopt

the associated fees. Should the fees be approved at that time, DHHS-Public Health would then be able to begin collecting those fees, 30 days after the public hearing in fund 1175, budget unit 411-Hazardous Material Program. Annual revenue is anticipated to \$55,837 based on the attached fees.

2. Set the Amendment to Ordinance No. 2718 for adoption on June 7, 2024, to take effect and be in force thirty (30) days from the date of its adoption; and
3. Direct the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors to publish the pre-adoption summary of the ordinance; and
4. Direct the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors to post a certified copy of the full text of the ordinance in the office of the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at least five (5) days prior to the Board of Supervisors meeting at which the ordinance will be adopted [Government Code Section 25124(b)(1)]; and
5. Direct the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors to publish a post-adoption summary of the ordinance within fifteen (15) days after the adoption of ordinance with names of Supervisors voting for a certified copy of the full text of the adopted ordinance along with the names of those Supervisors voting for and against the ordinance [Government Code Section 25124(b)(1)].

DISCUSSION:

On December 21, 2022, the State of California enacted SB 793 in response to the rising epidemic of youth usage of flavored tobacco products; the targeted marketing of certain flavored tobacco products to communities of color, low-income individuals, and the LGBTQ community; and the aggressive marketing of menthol-flavored products to African American community members.

On August 16, 2022, the Board of Supervisors requested Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) - Public Health to draft a Tobacco Retail Licensing Ordinance.

On May 23, 2023, the Board of Supervisors introduced Ordinance No. 2718 and the Ordinance was adopted on July 11, 2023.

On December 12, 2023, the Board of Supervisors voted to adopt the Fiscal Year (FY) 2023-2024 Humboldt County Schedule of Fees and Charges for permits and services, which included Tobacco Retail Licenses.

On February 27, 2024, the Board of Supervisors and DHHS-Public Health discussed possible revisions to the following sections of Ordinance No. 2718 Section 817-4 Tobacco Product Pricing, Placement, and Packaging:

1. Subdivision (d) Prohibition of Tobacco Coupons and Discounts: (3) provide any free or discounted item to a consumer in consideration for the purchase of any tobacco product.
2. Subdivision (e) Placement of Tobacco Products: Tobacco products or advertisements relating to tobacco shall not be placed or displayed within five (5) feet of candy, snacks, nor nonalcoholic beverages.

DHHS - Public Health brings forth the Amendment to Ordinance No. 2718 to update the language in section 817-4 Tobacco Product Pricing, Placement, and Packing, removing the five (5) foot language and replacing it with language around tobacco products either being behind a counter or in a locked case. DHHS - Public Health also updates section 817-19 Exceptions to include new language regarding exceptions to the Coupons and Discounts of tobacco products.

Enacting this Amendment to Ordinance No. 2718 will not unduly burden the legitimate business activities of retailers who sell tobacco products to adults. It is the intent of Ordinance No. 2718 is to ensure compliance with the business standards and practices of the county, encourage responsible tobacco retailing, and discourage violations of tobacco-related laws, especially those which prohibit or discourage the sale or distribution of tobacco products to youth.

3. Direct the Clerk of the Board to publish the required pre-adoption summary of the Ordinance to be done at least 5 days prior to the date set for adoption; and
4. Direct the Clerk of the Board within 15 days after the adoption of the Ordinance, to publish a post-adoption summary of the Ordinance with the names of the Supervisors voting for and against the Ordinance, and to post in the office of the Clerk of the Board a certified copy of the full text of the adopted Ordinance and amendments along with the names of those Supervisors voting for and against the Ordinance.

DISCUSSION:

Nitrous oxide is a colorless gas that is commonly used as an anesthetic for dental and other medical procedures, as well as being used as a charging agent for whipped cream cannisters. The use of nitrous oxide as an inhalant for recreational drug purposes has become popular and has been linked to serious health problems, which can cause physical and mental illness, injury and in some cases, even death. The Alcohol and Drug Foundation describes that long term adverse consequences from excessive recreational nitrous oxide can include memory loss; low blood pressure; Vitamin B12 depletion; brain and nerve damage; lack of judgement and safety awareness; weakened immune system; depression; psychological dependence; psychosis and dependence or addiction. If a large amount of recreational nitrous oxide is used in one sitting, it can lead to loss of blood pressure and fainting. There is no known beneficial use of recreational nitrous oxide, especially for young people. A recent research study from March 2025 in *The Lancet* showed that youth as young as 14 years old are experiencing sustained neurological damage due to recreational nitrous oxide use.

Nitrous oxide is often sold in cannisters called "whip-its" and can be purchased throughout Humboldt County's retail landscape,

especially at smoke shops. The prevalence of these cannisters in stores and the proximity of those stores to schools and recreational areas allows nitrous oxide to be easily accessible to our youth. According to the 2021-2023 California Healthy Kids Survey Humboldt County Secondary Report, 11% of Grade 7 and Grade 11 students reported already having used inhalants and inhalants were found to be an initiation drug for 5th grade students.

It has long been recognized by many that recreational nitrous oxide use is a significant issue that impacts the health and well-being of our community. Enacting the Ordinance will not unduly burden the legitimate business activities of retailers who sell other products, including tobacco products. It is the intent of the Ordinance to ensure compliance with the business standards and practices of the county, encourage responsible retailing and discourage violations of nitrous oxide-related laws, especially those which prohibit or discourage the sale or distribution of nitrous oxide.

On Jan. 9, 2024, the Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution 24-4 titled Resolution of the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors Addressing the Sale, Distribution and Use of Nitrous Oxide in Humboldt County.

Today the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) - Public Health brings forth an Amendment of Ordinance No. 2718 to add the language in section 817-13 to revoke a tobacco retailer's license if it is in violation of selling Nitrous Oxide.

Also coming before your Board today on staff report 25-601 is the Introduction of the Comprehensive Nitrous Oxide Ordinance that will make it unlawful for any person in the County of Humboldt, with exceptions, to sell or attempt to sell, offer, distribute or provide Nitrous Oxide to any person.

DISCUSSION:

Nitrous oxide, commonly used in medical procedures and food preparation, has gained popularity as a recreational inhalant, posing serious health risks such as neurological damage, addiction, and even fatal outcomes. Research published in The Lancet (March 2025) highlights sustained neurological harm in youth as young as 14.

Sold in canisters known as "whip-its," nitrous oxide is widely available across Humboldt County, particularly in smoke shops near schools and recreational areas, making access easy for young people. According to the 2021-2023 California Healthy Kids Survey, 11% of local 7th and 11th graders have used inhalants, with 5th graders identifying them as an initiation drug.

Recognizing the public health concerns, the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) - Public Health Branch brought a resolution to the Board of Supervisors on January 9, 2024, identifying nitrous oxide as a critical local issue and initiating research into its harmful effects.

On May 6, 2025, DHHS - Public Health Branch introduced the Comprehensive Nitrous Oxide Ordinance, making it unlawful, with certain exceptions, to sell, offer, distribute, or provide nitrous oxide in Humboldt County.

Today, DHHS - Public Health Branch returns to the Board of Supervisors seeking approval for the Ordinance's adoption, reinforcing efforts to regulate nitrous oxide sales while maintaining responsible business practices and protecting community health.

This amendment is before the Board for adoption today.
