Dear Dr. Stockton,

Following is the financial information requested in your letter of December 4, 2023 in support of our ambulance rate increase request for Zone 1. I chose to wait until calendar year 2023 information was finalized in order to show a 3 year period, and to adjust for a misallocation of expenses in 2022, and an overstatement of revenue in 2023 that was only recently corrected.

The focus of the rate adjustment is to increase EMT and paramedic wages to make sure they are in line with surrounding areas. The recent increase in City Ambulance rates, largely for the same purpose, puts additional pressure on wages here. We are fortunate to have a stable workforce, many of which have been with the company for over 10 years. We work hard to maintain that.

The proposed rates reflect an increase of 25% to the base and mileage rates. Due to the large percentage of our patients covered by Medi-Cal and Medicare, and the roughly 10% of patients with no coverage, the percentage increase has to be substantial to generate the necessary revenue.

- Consolidated P&L years 2021, 2022, and 2023*
- Rate schedule showing current and proposed rates
- Payroll table* showing 7.2% pay increase (expected implementation 10/1/24). A 2.8% increase took place in March of this year.
- Payer Mix* showing 2023 calls. Increased rates will only apply to a percentage of the Commercial Insurance and the VA categories.

I look forward to meeting to discuss this rate increase proposal, or any other aspect of the operations of the company.
