- 1. County Code Section 431-23.5 established parking on Drydens Road (County Road No. 4Q110) in Orick. This is to establish time restricted parking as no parking from PM 0.393 to PM 0.559 between the hours of 10 pm to 5 am.
- 2. County Code Section 431-61.0.4 established parking on Jackson Ranch Road (County Road No. 3L1020) in Arcata. This is to establish time restricted parking as no parking from PM 0.539 to PM 0.563 between the hours of 12 am to 5 am.

Reasons why project is exempt:

The proposed ordinance (project) affects traffic regulations on existing County maintained roads. Paragraph (c) of said Section specifically cites an exemption for existing highways and streets, sidewalks, gutters, bicycle and pedestrian trails, and similar facilities (this includes road grading for the purpose of public safety, and other alterations such as the addition of bicycle facilities, including but not limited to bicycle parking, bicycle-share facilities and bicycle lanes, transit improvements such as bus lanes, pedestrian crossings, street trees, and other similar alterations that do not create additional automobile lanes).
