Dear Planning Department and Board Members,

Since being part of the attempt to appeal the Planning department's approval of the expansion nextdoor to our home at the end of Hindley Ranch Road, Honeydew, we have tried to go back to our normal lives and not monitor our neighbors compliance, or not, of the various things that the resolution of the appeal asked them to do. This stuff can fill your whole life if you let it. And we have lots of other activities and responsibilities.

Yet we were very sorry to hear that Dany Avi David was still attempting to expand the number of greenhouses in his operations in our neighborhood, with this lot line adjustment appeal. We hope this will not be allowed.

We were at the last hearing and were sorry to see the matter continued so that the lawyer and consultant could reform their argument. Whether the adjustment gives them 17, 20, or 60 acres, it is still not an appropriate expansion given the imposition to the neighbors, the disregard to the decision the BOS made last time, as well as the restrictions of developing the neighborhood access lot.

Our neighborhood is already oversaturated with huge operations, and all the traffic, noise, smell, road degradation, fire dangers, water concerns, etc. It was wrong for Dany Avi David, and his partners named and not named, to expand last time, and it is still wrong.
