**DISCUSSION:**

This item involves the comprehensive update of the Commercial Cannabis Land Use Ordinance (CCLUO) which regulates the cultivation, processing, manufacturing, distribution and sale of medical and adult use of cannabis in Humboldt County. Recently staff learned the full Board would not be present at the meeting on February 27, and given the importance of this item, staff recommends the Board continue the item to a special meeting where all the Board members will be present, to be held on March 19, 2018.

**FINANCIAL IMPACT:**

The cost of preparing this staff report is less than \$300, which is being paid by the General Fund contribution to the Planning and Building Department, Long Range Planning Unit's FY 2017-18 budget.

The proposed ordinance is consistent with the Board's 2017 Strategic Framework as it will help enforce laws and regulations to protect residents, create opportunities for improved safety and health, encourage new local enterprise, and support business, workforce development and creation of private-sector jobs.
