

Describe how the scope of your proposal fits the intent of Measure Z. Specifically, how will it maintain and improve public safety and essential services?*

California's constitution guarantees the right to counsel by ensuring that individuals, regardless of financial status, have legal representation. This right is also protected by the U.S. Constitution. This prevents unlawful convictions and promotes trust in the legal system. California relies on individual counties to provide this essential service. Indigent defense is a critical component of public safety. A well-functioning indigent defense system promotes justice and efficiency and helps avoid case backlogs in the courts, unnecessary pretrial detentions, and costly appeals and lawsuits. This efficiency ensures the legal system can focus on prosecuting actual threats to public safety. Indigent defense upholds the integrity of the justice system, ensures fair legal representation, and prevents wrongful convictions—all of which contribute to a safer society. An adequately staffed Public Defender Office improves public safety by: a. Reducing Recidivism - Quality legal representation ensures that defendants receive fair sentencing, diversion programs, or rehabilitative alternatives when appropriate. This approach helps reduce repeat offenses and promotes reintegration into society. b. Enhancing Public Trust in the Justice System - A fair and just legal system fosters community confidence. When people believe the system treats all individuals fairly, they are more likely to cooperate with law enforcement and participate in the legal process. c. Preventing Wrongful Convictions – When defendants receive adequate legal defense, the risk of imprisoning innocent individuals decreases. Wrongful convictions not only ruin lives but also allow the actual perpetrators to remain free, posing a continued threat to public safety. d. Balancing Law Enforcement Power - Indigent defense ensures that government prosecution is checked by competent legal advocacy, preventing overreach such as prosecutorial overcharging, police misconduct, and systemic biases that can erode public confidence and safety. By ensuring legal representation for all individuals, regardless of economic status, indigent defense strengthens the justice system's legitimacy and contributes to a safer, more just society.

Please provide a brief description of the proposal for which you are seeking funding.*

The Public Defender is requesting funding for the addition of one (1) FTE Deputy Public Defender. Due to budget constraints the Public Defender was required to eliminate two (2) FTE positions for FY 2024-25, including one full-time Deputy Public Defender. In 2024 (calendar year) new cases appointed by the courts increased significantly (see attached). Additionally, Humboldt County implemented CARE Court in response to the Community Assistance, Recovery and Empowerment (CARE) Act. The CARE Act allows specific people, called "petitioners," to ask the court to create a voluntary CARE agreement or court-ordered CARE plan for other persons, called "respondents," who have certain untreated severe mental illnesses, specifically schizophrenia or other psychotic disorders. A CARE agreement or plan may include treatment, housing support, and other services requiring the Public Defender Office to represent CARE Act respondents. CARE Act petitions are filed in civil court requiring the Public Defender to implement additional services. Increased cases appointed by the court, the implementation of the CARE Act, and the elimination of one (1) Deputy Public Defender position has exceeded the Public Defender Office's capacity to provide mandated services adequately. The high caseloads significantly exceed American Bar Association recommendations making the recruitment and retention of qualified Deputy Public Defenders very difficult. Public Defenders are bound by strict ethical requirements to ensure fair legal representation and uphold the integrity of the justice system and are required to provide competent legal representation while staying informed on changes in the law and ensuring diligent case preparation. The continued funding of one (1) FTE additional Deputy Public Defender will reduce the current active caseload of the existing two (2) FTE Deputy Public Defenders assigned to represent clients charged with misdemeanors from over 400 cases each to a minimum of 267 active cases each.

How have you developed a plan for sustainability, including diversification of funding sources, for your proposal to carry on without reliance on future Measure Z funds? Please provide detail of your plan for sustainability here.*

Funding options for indigent defense services are highly restricted. As a mandated service, California Public Defender Offices primarily depend on the general fund and public safety tax apportionments to ensure adequate legal representation for county residents. State law prohibits charging fees for indigent defense, and state or federal grants for such programs are exceedingly rare. When grants do become available, they often come with stringent requirements that necessitate additional services. At the time of this application, we are not aware of any eligible state or federal grants that would increase our capacity to manage existing caseloads.

This request is for the continuation of existing service levels funded by the County's General Fund.

If you are awarded Measure Z funds, how do you plan to leverage these funds to secure additional grants, contributions or community support? *

The Public Defender Office will continue to search for available grant funding. The requested Measure Z funds will allow the Chief Public Defender to interact with other agencies, including The Office of the State Public Defender, to identify potential funding sources, as well as meeting with State representatives regarding increased funding for indigent defense services.
