RECOMMENDATION(S):

That the Board of Supervisors appoint Marsha Mielke and Laurie Bissell-Ruggles to the Humboldt County Behavioral Health Board for three year terms.

SOURCE OF FUNDING:

Mental Health Fund

DISCUSSION:

The Humboldt County Behavioral Health Board is a requirement of Welfare and Institutions Code 5604, and was established per the Lanterman-Petris-Short Act of 1967. The County and the Department of Health and Human Services actively support the Behavioral Health Board. The Humboldt County Behavioral Health Board meets monthly and consists of 15 members. Meetings of the Behavioral Health Board are subject to the provisions of the Brown Act. Counties are encouraged to appoint individuals who have experience and knowledge of the mental health system. The Behavioral Health Board should reflect the diversity of the client population in the County. Fifty percent of the membership shall be consumers or the parent, spouse, sibling or adult children of consumers who are receiving or have received mental health services.

Laurie Bissell-Ruggles, Application to Serve on Humboldt County Behavioral Health Board 10)

The path of raising a son with the dual diagnosis of mental illness and developmental delays is extremely complicated in that the causes, symptoms, and treatments are so intertwined yet often approached separately. If you think about it, it makes sense that a huge part of the disabled community suffers from mental health issues as well. The isolation, stigma, rejection, and frustration felt from the lack of social acceptance on top of impaired abilities could make anyone feel hopeless, then magnified when combined with mental illness.

My son, now 18, grew up with multiple developmental disabilities, some of which with therapy we could work through, such as motor skills, and stuttering, but others he needs to adapt his life around. He has Asperger Syndrome, which is a high-functioning Autism Spectrum Disorder diagnosis, resulting in difficulty understanding social norms, impaired organizational skills, and the tendency to focus obsessively on something (physical or mental). Yet he is brilliant, very empathetic, and creative. His brain literally processes information differently.

He has generally been treated as a freak by his peers, and during second grade the mental illness symptoms began to appear. In second grade he wanted to be dead, so I dropped my law practice so that I could home school my son through a charter school. At 11 years old, he was diagnosed with major depression and anxiety. At 12 years old, he attempted suicide.

The lack of information and support for families in this situation took us down a lot of unnecessary, painful and damaging paths. We bungled our way through educational, medical, and mental health services. We acquired a lot of insight in the process, although in an achingly isolated way. He currently attends HSU, and through his own growth and insight seems to be taking charge of his life.

My passion is to help other families access the information, the support, and the voice to interact with service providers and the community in ways that help others understand their family member's needs. Family insight can also be the most influential support to other families, especially in coping with the everyday challenges.

Over the last few years, I have focused both my work and volunteer efforts on working with special needs children and their families. Through the Humboldt County Behavioral Health Board, I hope to contribute as a parent, and find ways to access more families to educate, support, and advocate for their children. I currently am one of only a handful of strictly family members of the Humboldt BRIDGES/Children's System of Care central team, and part of the Family Driven committee. Although my focus is children, I am also experienced and passionate about broader mental health issues.
