4. Describe how the scope of your proposal fits the intent of *Measure Z*. Specifically, how will it maintain and improve public safety and essential services, as described on the previous page?

The Genasys Evacuation Management Platform and Community Evacuation Interface is a cloud-based software that provides a comprehensive set of evacuation tools that make it easy for fire, law, and emergency management to build and maintain evacuation plans and train using accurate evacuation simulations and scenarios. During a live emergency incident, the Evacuation Management Platform enables responsible agencies to react swiftly, make informed evacuation decisions, and communicate evacuation status updates in real-time to other agencies and the public.

This software reduces emergency management's reflex time in issuing evacuation notifications to the public and improves operational efficiency during emergency events by allowing for the creation of "evacuation preplans." The platform also allows fire, law enforcement, and emergency management personnel to collaborate in real-time to run evacuation scenarios and determine evacuation zones to be put under an evacuation order or warning status during a local emergency event. The Community Evacuation Interface offers an accessible, real-time map to Humboldt County residents to obtain information about pre-incident preparedness, as well as crisis communications and life-safety information during local and regional emergencies.

Additionally, the Genasys Protect TRAFFIC AI software assists emergency management and public safety personnel in identifying critical evacuation zones and identifying the safest evacuation routes based on estimated times to safety through real-time traffic modeling in a GIS platform.

5. Please provide a brief description of the proposal for which you are seeking funding.

Funding this proposal would allow for the continuation of life-saving services to the public and would support a well-coordinated emergency response for fire, law, and emergency management during times of crisis. This proposal supports sustaining services for a three-year period. Services provided through the three-year contract with Genasys include the Evacuation Management Platform, which assists with rapid evacuation mapping and notifications, Community Evacuation Interface, which provides real-time information to Humboldt County residents during evacuation emergencies, and TRAFFIC AI, which will assist with evacuation route planning and better understanding unique evacuation challenges in areas of the county with limited transportation and travel access.

6. How have you developed a plan for sustainability, including diversification of funding sources, for your proposal to carry on without reliance on future *Measure Z* funds? Please provide detail of your plan for sustainability here.

The Humboldt County Sheriff's Office is currently working towards realigning existing position allocations and the current department budget to provide additional support in grants management, which will provide for increased opportunities to seek and administer grant programs that could fund services such as this. This project supports a service that benefits numerous jurisdictions and agencies within Humboldt County, there is potential for cost-sharing in future contract terms for agencies that wish to utilize the evacuation management platform.

7. If this request is for the continuation or expansion of an existing program/service, what is the current source of funding for that program/service?

The current source of funding for this service is the Humboldt County General Fund. In 2021, the Board of Supervisors allocated one-time funding to support a three-year contract with Zonehaven (now Genasys). The existing three-year contract expires on July 31, 2024, which generally aligns with peak fire season in the State of California. It is critical that access to this life-saving platform is renewed in advance of fire season to ensure continuity of services.

8. If you are awarded *Measure Z* funds, how do you plan to leverage these funds to secure additional grants, contributions or community support?

If awarded, this proposal will fund Genasys Protect products for a period of three years, during which time we aim to explore various grant opportunities through state and/or federal agencies. The Humboldt County Sheriff's Office is currently working towards realigning existing position allocations and the current department budget to provide additional support in grants management, which will provide for increased opportunities to seek and administer grant programs that could fund services such as this.

9. Will this proposal require new or expanded activity on the part of another entity to be fully functional and effective? If so, name that entity and describe what that participation would look like.

No, this is an already existing service/program managed by the Sheriff's Office of Emergency Services. The functionality and effectiveness of the service relies on already existing partnerships with public safety agencies and Operational Area jurisdictions throughout Humboldt County.
