Thank you for seeking Caltrans input on the revised proposal to subdivide of a four-acre parcel, which would result in the creation of six lots for single family residential use. The previous proposal would subdivide the same parcel into seven residential lots. The project is located adjacent to the southbound lanes (west side) of US Route 101, and south of School Street, in the unincorporated community of McKinleyville. We offer the following feedback:

In our letter of February 13, 2023, we noted that the on-site retention of stormwater runoff was insufficient to accommodate the 100-year storm runoff for the proposed seven residential lots due to errors in the runoff calculations. The elimination of one of the parcels reduces the amount of the proposed new impervious surface area. We have reviewed your calculations and we find minor discrepancies that result in a proposed design with slightly more storage than required. The proposed three-thousand cubic-foot (3,000 CF) detention pond is slightly larger than the 2,781 CF of capacity that we calculate to be needed.
