POST-ADOPTION SUMMARY OF URGENCY ORDINANCE CONTINUING A TEMPORARY MORATORIUM ON THE CULTIVATION OF INDUSTRIAL HEMP BY "ESTABLISHED AGRICULTURAL RESEARCH INSTITUTIONS" OR OTHERS WITHIN THE UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF COASTAL ZONE OF THE COUNTY, WHICH SHALL TAKE IMMEDIATE EFFECT

On Tuesday, June 22, 2021, during its regularly scheduled Board meeting, the Humboldt County
Board of Supervisors adopted urgency Ordinance No, to take immediate effect,
extending a temporary moratorium on the cultivation of industrial hemp as otherwise provided
by California Food and Agriculture Code sections 81000 – 81011 by "established agricultural
research institutions" or others within the unincorporated area within the Coastal Zone of the
County of Humboldt. The moratorium will continue in effect for six months after adoption of
this extension and may be extended by further action by the Board of Supervisors within that
time period for a total of up to two years. A four-fifths vote is required for adoption of any
additional extension.
