# Describe how the scope of your proposal fits the intent of Measure Z. Specifically, how will it maintain and improve public safety and essential services?\*

Seeking to create balance in one's own behavioral health and wellness can positively ripple out from the individual healing into their circle of support and family. These benefits often continue to flow outward through neighborhoods, social circles, communities, jobs, and more. Mental and behavioral wellness can enhance an entire community, when prevention and healing become a priority. The messages surrounding behavioral health (a term that encompasses all contributions to mental wellness, including challenges with substance use, behavior, habits and other outside factors) trickle down from levels of administration and influence the culture of emergency responders so greatly that even asking for help, the very response needed to begin the healing process, can be muted unintentionally by well-meaning leaders. Providing proven, effective and varied support options that enhance skill sets in prevention, crisis intervention, acute challenge management, and ongoing maintenance in behavioral health provides tangible, immediate benefits to all levels within the First Responder's network of collaborators. This approach not only equips individuals with a wide range of tools to address immediate issues and sustain progress but also reinforces our collective commitment to proactive and resilient care. There's no cookie-cutter solution when it comes to recovery. If behavioral health services rely solely on one-on-one therapy, there will always be some who, despite the availability of options, hesitate to seek help due to fear or personal preference. Similarly, exclusively offering group therapy may not reach those who find the idea of sharing vulnerabilities in a peer setting overwhelming. To truly support the diverse needs of first responders, we must offer balanced and varied options. My new group program, Rural Response is designed as an alternative pathway for those who might not connect with traditional therapy formats, ensuring broader access to the support needed to maintain and enhance behavioral health. Creating an innovative space for open and ongoing groups that are affordable, provide in-person support, and allow trauma-informed clinicians to support up to 15 responders in one-and-a-half-hours versus supporting one emergency responder in 50 minutes. Rural Response seeks to fill a large gap in a community desperately in need of mental health therapists knowledgeable in the unique culture of rural emergency responders.

#### Please provide a brief description of the proposal for which you are seeking funding.\*

This innovative, culturally humble, and comprehensive group therapy program is specifically designed for local law enforcement and fire department agencies (dispatchers included) serving in Humboldt County. Sessions are offered in two groups, one specifically tailored for Law Enforcement and the other for Fire Personnel. All relevant agencies, including Fish and Game, City Police, Tribal Police, and the Sheriff's Department, are permitted to participate in their respective group sessions. The fire personnel groups will also integrate Humboldt Bay Fire, local volunteer fire departments and tribal fire departments as well. Rural Response seeks to help foster stronger interagency connection and collaboration amongst first responders in the community. Our region is unique, and the relationships between all collaborative agencies during critical incidents must be supported and reinforced. Rural Response provides a structured, supportive environment aimed at facilitating healing, enabling first responders to manage stress, trauma, and behaviors that lead to addiction more effectively. Through targeted therapeutic interventions, the program aims to improve overall mental health, strengthen relationships in the home and community, and enhance job performance at all levels.

# How have you developed a plan for sustainability, including diversification of funding sources, for your proposal to carry on without reliance on future Measure Z funds? Please provide detail of your plan for sustainability here.\*

These Measure Z funds would provide a launchpad for Rural Response. As an active, engaged LCSW and clinician in the community, I'm constantly soliciting funding from academic institutions (Cal Poly / CR), from other local non-profits such as Code3 Mind Health (A 501(c)3 operating in Northern California), and other local professionals in the community. Should I fail to secure funding to launch Rural Response from this application, I will continue to engage local grant writers and collaborators in accessing monies to offer this service. The end goal is simple: Reinforce and invigorate the First Responders in this community through access to mental health services. I have already purchased a facility and invested in more than a decade of higher education in this pursuit, and the money is there. You are just the best fitting location to secure it first! Built into the proposal, are the static costs associated with maintaining the business. The per-group cost illustrated as a client payment, in the proposal, will help with meeting my financial needs to continue practice. While Rural Response is a stand-alone, non-integrated group program (meaning, none of my other practice interacts with this business. Clients from one aspect of my practice do not participate in Rural Response, unless they qualify as First Responders), I am a practicing mental Health Clinician with my own stand-alone facility in Fortuna, California.

# If you are awarded Measure Z funds, how do you plan to leverage these funds to secure additional grants, contributions or community support? \*

Pending a successful rollout of Rural Response, I will continue to build professional connections and collaborations locally, and within the greater Mental Health community. This business is built to be both portable (able to, in time, travel to any local to host appropriate groups, should the need arise) and scalable. This business is able to expand exponentially, integrating other Mental health clinicians, other locations, and larger demographics if the need arises in service to first responders. Along with these collaborations and professional advancements come a variety of opportunities to market outward. First responders are part of the fabric of our society, and Rural Response is the result of unmet or undermet needs in that demographic. I am currently in conversation with a new local (Fort Bragg) non-profit organization, Code 3 Mind Health, who have offered to function as a pass-through nonprofit allowing me to utilize their 501(c)(3) to fundraise for this program. I have been given the official "Yes" from their board and am awaiting a contract conversation. Once this is completed, I plan to do 2-3 fundraisers a year, ongoing, to help fund Rural Response. I am also in conversation with Cal Poly Humboldt with a fundraiser idea. I wrote a proposal requesting an opportunity to create a one- or two-day training opportunity for both current and past Social Work and Psychology students interested in becoming culturally informed to effectively and compassionately support and understand the behavioral health challenges first responders might experience thru this work. I will both co-create the event and co-host, while amplifying the voices of experts in this work. Although I have not received an official "yes," on the project, Dr. Bowers has moved forward on her end to create a committee with Cal Poly Humboldt staff for this event which feels promising. I hope to use the profits from this training to create a mental health stipend for Humboldt County first responders.

Yes. This proposal and accompanying budget represent 50% of operational expenses in my private practice. All budgetary requests cover approximately half of the real expenses of establishing, running, and maintaining my facility, which is the approximate footprint that Rural Response will make in my day-to-day operations. Ideally, should this business prove successful, I would renew my request for the following monies: personnel, overhead and occupancy, limited Supplies, And potentially an expansion into travel expenses, as roll out traveling group sessions to best serve the largest number of First Responders in the most rural locations of our region.

To Whom It May Concern,

My name is Jesse Bugbee, and I am a registered Nurse Practitioner and Fire Captain for the Rio Dell Volunteer Fire Department. I have spent the last 17 years working in various areas of emergency response as an Emergency Technician, Emergency Nurse, Nurse manager, and Sexual Assault Forensic Nurse Examiner. I also went through the Eel River Fire Academy in 2018 and have been an active volunteer firefighter. In these roles, I collaborate with paramedics, firefighters, and law enforcement daily.

Throughout my career, I have noticed a significant lack of support for mental health among first responders. After difficult cases, we would often try to support each other or discuss our experiences with other colleagues involved. Many of the mental health programs established for first responders are peer-led, which can be helpful, but they are no substitute for the guidance that can be provided by a trained and licensed mental health professional.

I want to highlight Shannon, a licensed clinical social worker who has spent the last 12 years focusing on trauma and more recently dedicated to learning the unique experiences of firefighters, emergency personnel, paramedics, emergency nurses, and law enforcement. In our rural community, mental health resources are scarce. I frequently encounter professionals struggling with their emotions, it is incredibly challenging to find a counselor who is even minimally versed in the everyday trauma associated with first responder professions.

I have benefited from Shannon's expertise. Whenever I experience traumatic events in my professional or volunteer work, she is one of the first people I turn to. I make it a point to refer any patients with a law enforcement, EMS, or fire background to her because of her specialized training and understanding of our experiences.

It is our community leadership's responsibility to prioritize the mental health of all individuals, especially those we expect to always be ready and available when there is a crisis. Protecting our first responders from adverse effects is crucial, and establishing accessible pathways to evaluation and counseling would be an essential step toward supporting our community.

Shannan has the training and passion for aiding first responders, she has volunteered much of her time to educate herself and to provide counseling and support. With appropriate funding, she could offer more expansive support and dedicate time to providing desperately needed services.
