Over time, due to DHHS-Mental Health's increased outreach efforts to homeless persons with mental health issues, the \$1,200.00 amount became insufficient to fund new programs such as the Mobile Intervention Services Team (MIST). The Petty Cash Fund allows DHHS-Mental Health Administration and Programs to finance the expenditure of small sums of cash as needed including out-of-pocket expenditures, minor cost items and supplies which become necessary through the normal course of work in a cost-effective manner.

On May 19, 2015 (item C-7), the Board of Supervisors approved an increase to the existing Petty Cash Fund for DHHS-Mental Health from \$1,200.00 to \$1,700.00 for the Humboldt County Department of Health and Human Services - Mental Health / Administration and Programs, Budget Unit #424, Fund 1170, as follows: Mental Health Administration and programs 1170-424-2123 Special Departmental Expense -- \$500.00; however, the required supporting Resolution was not included.

This agenda item is coming to your Board with the required new Resolution and request to rescind Resolution #07-49.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Revenue sources for the Petty Cash Fund may include Realignment, Medi-Cal federal financial participation (FFP), Mental Health Services Act allocations and grant funding. These petty cash funds will be established using existing appropriation in expenditure line item 2-123, Special Departmental Expense. There is no impact to the county's General Fund.

This item supports the Board of Supervisors strategic framework by assisting programs that create opportunities for improved safety and health. These programs also protect vulnerable populations, provide community-appropriate levels of service and invite civic engagement and awareness of services.

ALTERNATIVES TO STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

The Board can choose not to approve this Resolution; however, DHHS does not recommend this alternative. The Board approved increasing the DHSS-Mental Health Petty Cash Fund amount on May 19, 2015. Without the Resolution, DHHS-Mental Health would not have access to the increased fund amount.

RESOLUTION TO ESTABLISH A REVOLVING PETTY CASH FUND FOR USE BY HUMBOLDT COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES -MENTAL HEALTH ADMINISTRATION AND PROGRAMS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,700

WHEREAS, Section 29321 of the Government Code of California authorizes the Board of Supervisors to establish revolving funds for the use of any Officer of the County; and

WHEREAS, the Director of the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) has requested the establishment of a revolving fund in the amount of One Thousand Seven Hundred Dollars (\$1,700.00) in DHHS-Mental Health's Administration unit to finance the expenditure of small sums of cash in the daily operation of Mental Health Administration and Programs including out-of-pocket expenditures, minor cost items and supplies as needed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Humboldt hereby establishes a revolving fund in the amount of One Thousand Seven Hundred Dollars (\$1,700.00) to be used by DHHS-Mental Health Administration and Programs staff in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth above and subject to the provisions of Section 29321 of the Government Code.
