## PROCLAMATION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS COUNTY OF HUMBOLDT

WHEREAS, Two Feathers Native American Family Services is a chartered entity of Big Lagoon Rancheria, a federally recognized tribe of Humboldt County; and

WHEREAS, Humboldt County is home to eight federally recognized tribes with a population of 11,972 Native Americans, approximately 53% of whom are Native women at 6,345, and 24% Native children at 2,873; and

WHEREAS, Native American women are at least 3 times more likely to be sexually assaulted in their lifetime, twice that of other women in the United States, it is our hope that with the passing of VAWA and the inclusion of Tribal Authority this will improve; and

WHEREAS, 18% of all women are sexually assaulted each year, 34% of whom are Native American/Alaskan Native women, 15% of reported sexual assaults are children under the age of 12; and

WHEREAS, 70% of all reported sexual crimes in the United States involve children; 1 in 3-4 girls and 1 in 6 boys are sexually abused before the age of 18, and 1 in 5 children is solicited sexually while on the internet, Native children having the highest rates of victimization; and

WHEREAS, this month, we emphasize the importance of understanding that the devastating lifelong effects of Sexual Assault, and Child Abuse and neglect, are epidemics we commit to learn more about; and

WHEREAS, the mission of Two Feathers Native American Family Services is to increase public awareness and to serve Native American victims of child abuse, domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking and dating violence in Humboldt county by providing social services, therapy, and emergency clothing, food and shelter. To date Two Feathers has provided services to more than 1000 Native American individuals and families in Humboldt County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors hereby express their appreciation to Two Feathers Native American Family Services for their dedicated service to victims of Child Abuse, Domestic Violence, Sexual Assault and Stalking in Humboldt County.
