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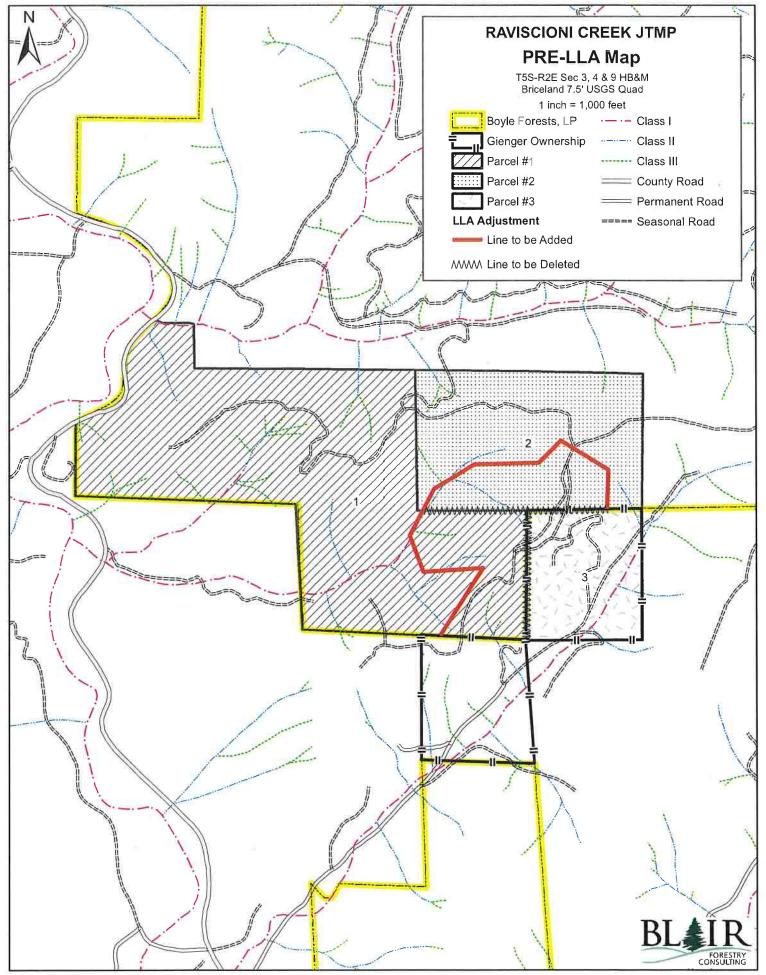
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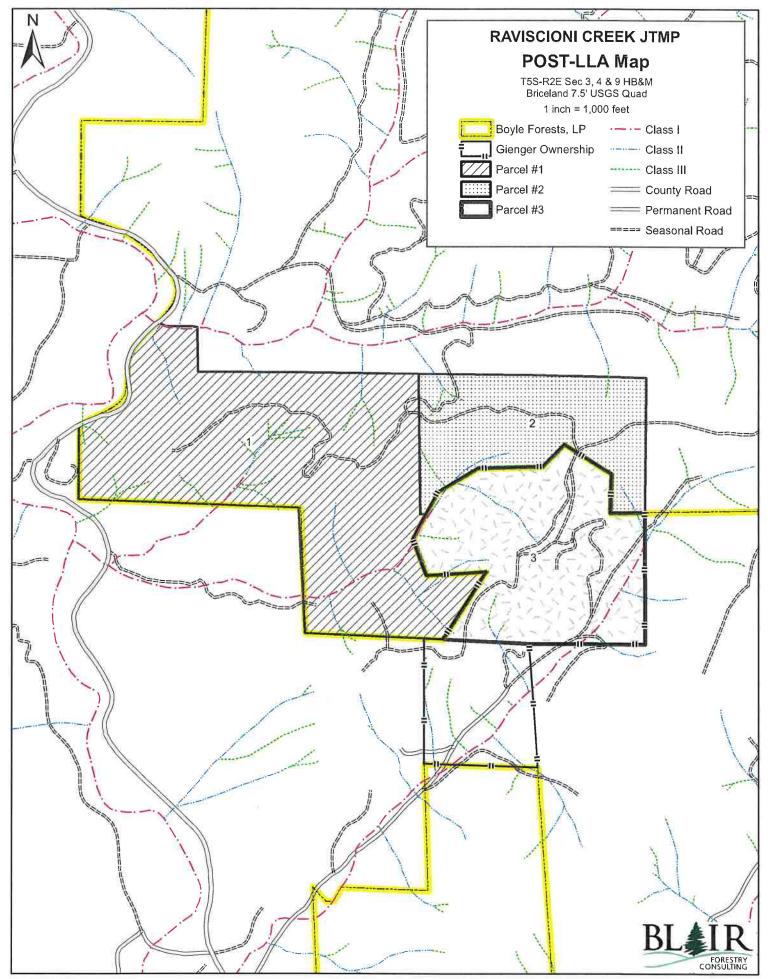

No development is proposed as part of this LLA.

The subject property is located within the State Fire Responsibility Area where the State of California has the primary responsibility for the prevention and suppression of wildland fires. CAL FIRE comments recommended compliance with the requirements of the County's Fire Safe Regulations. The Humboldt County Fire Safe Ordinance (Section 3111-1 et seq.) establishes development standards for minimizing wildfire danger in state responsibility designated areas. In addition, a portion of the project area is within the Whitethorn Fire Protection District who provides structural fire protection and responds to medical emergencies. No development is proposed with this Lot Line Adjustment.

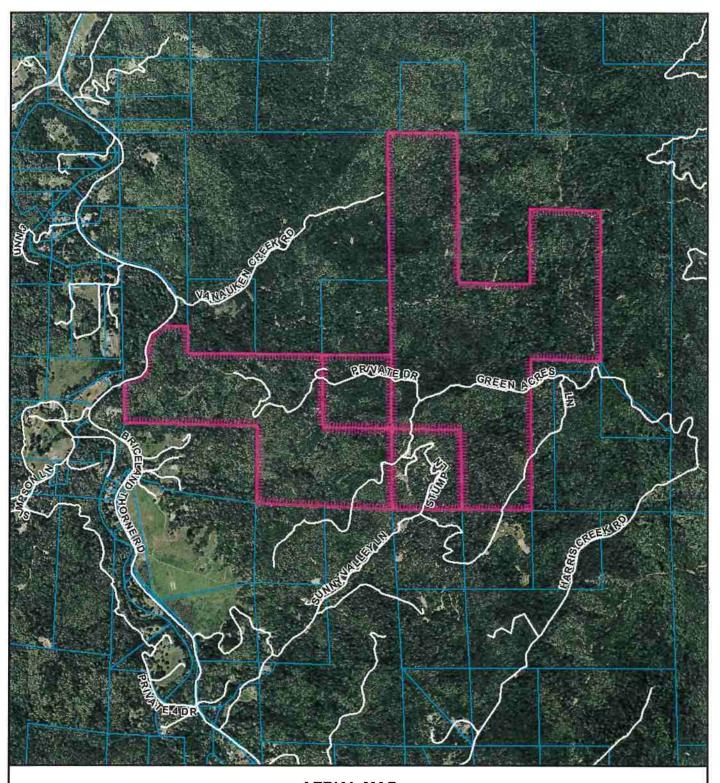
**5. Potential for Environmental Impact.** The following table identifies the evidence, which supports the finding that the proposed development will not adversely impact the environment.

**Referral Agency Comments and Recommendations:** All reviewing referral agencies responded with no comment or with a recommendation of approval.



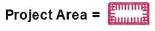




## **AERIAL MAP**

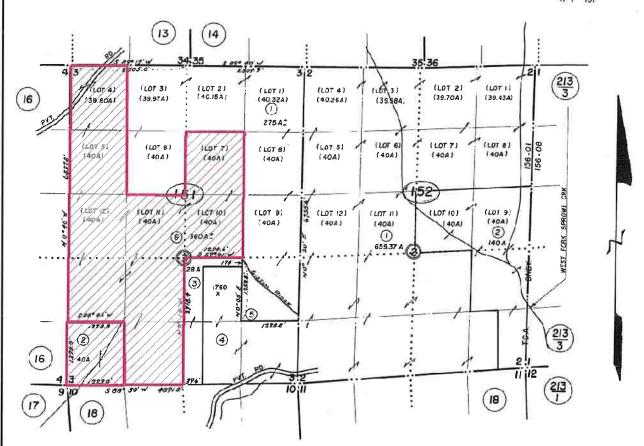

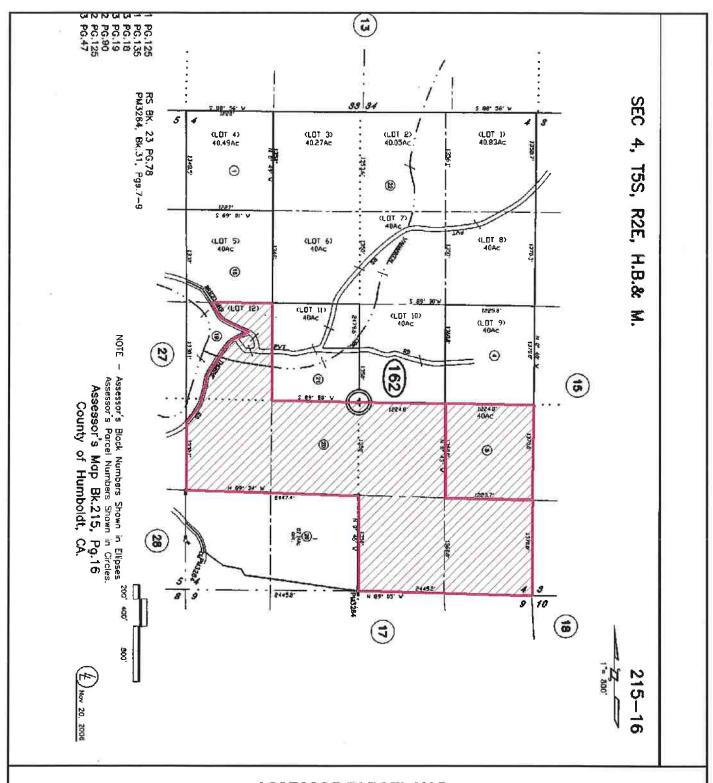
