Project Overview - Humboldt Trim Company (CCL20 - 0001587) is a locally farmer owned and operated, licensed cannabis processing (trimming) facility in downtown Eureka. Our mission is to provide farmers with fair turnkey solutions to sustain and grow their business by providing processing and packaging services for their freshly harvested products. We are committed to optimizing working relationships between farmers and retail channel partners, while creating a workplace of highly valued employees.

One of the major bottlenecks to our region's cannabis supply chain is commercial cannabis processing. Most Humboldt County cultivation permits do not allow for onsite processing and very few cannabis farms are able to meet the commercial building code and employee compliance requirements for legal processing. Humboldt Trim Company is working to bridge that gap, however, we are limited in increasing our employee capacity due to required ADA improvements. Trellis Grant funds would be utilized to assist us in adding one employee bathroom, that would enable the company to hire additional employees and better serve the local farm community.

Humboldt Trim Company recently began operations in October 2020. As a new start-up, all funds are currently dedicated to covering overhead and operating costs. As with most cannabis businesses, we are not eligible for small business loans which minimizes debt, but also restricts our opportunity. Our overall development plans for infrastructure improvements is expected to happen in phases. This next phase will be to add the required ADA features in order to increase our occupancy capacity. This phase has been delayed due in part to increased costs for COVID precautions and compliance.

With county support for this project, Humboldt Trim Company will be able to support a higher demand for much needed legal processing services for the cannabis farming community, and offer additional safe and gainful employment to more local residents.

Economic Impacts - We provide local jobs in the legal cannabis market. We currently provide a workspace for a maximum of 15 employees due to occupancy restrictions. Monthly product capabilities equate to production of 700 pounds of finished machine and/or hand trimmed products and bi-products. By meeting ADA compliance to increase our capacity, our facility will create an additional 12 full time positions. With additional employees, there would be an overall increase of over 40% trimming capacity resulting in an estimated increase of 300 pounds of processed product and additional monthly wages of \$25,000. These new jobs will positively impact the local economy.

There are many community and economic benefits to having cannabis that is grown, trimmed and packaged locally. By providing reliable and convenient pick-up services, we help ensure that rural farms have the necessary support crucial to remaining in the legal supply chain and continuing to contribute to sustainable economic growth. While there are many large scale trimming facilities throughout the State of California, it is vital that we create and secure more services and jobs locally.

Regarding community impact, our owners and executive team have been extremely active as members of two local farmer associations: Humboldt County Growers Alliance and the International Cannabis Farmers Association. Activities have included advocating for Humboldt farmers with visits to Sacramento to meet with legislators and their staff, supporting consumer education efforts such as hosting a table in Cannabis Row at San Diego's annual Earth Day event and supporting the award-winning "Taste of Terroir" booth at the local Feast of Fields event, serving as guest speaker to educate non-cannabis state Department of Health employees at their annual meeting, and participating in regular association meetings and conferences to support advocacy for improving regulations, policies, and initiatives that benefit the local farmers. In 2019 we developed a free Compliance Seminar Series for local farmers and had guest speakers from the various compliance agencies. These seminars were held in Eureka and in Garberville over a 5 month period.

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Project Process - Initial project design has been completed. Quotes have been obtained for the components needed. Once funding is secured, we will be able to order the necessary parts and begin to schedule the contractors. The project will begin with installing the exit door and the backflow system for the septic. It will then proceed with the construction of the bathroom, followed by plumbing work, electrical, and conclude with the ventilation. The project will conclude when we receive a final inspection from the city and approval to upgrade our occupancy. We will then recruit additional employees to fill the new hiring slots available.
