**POST-ADOPTION SUMMARY OF  
URGENCY ORDINANCE EXTENDING A  
TEMPORARY MORATORIUM ON THE  
CULTIVATION OF INDUSTRIAL HEMP  
BY "ESTABLISHED AGRICULTURAL  
RESEARCH INSTITUTIONS" OR  
OTHERS WITHIN THE UNINCORPORATED  
AREAS OF THE COUNTY,  
WHICH SHALL TAKE IMMEDIATE  
EFFECT**

On Tuesday, December 10, 2019, during its regularly scheduled Board meeting, the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors adopted Ordinance 2637 which extends urgency Ordinance No. 2632 to continue a temporary moratorium on the cultivation of industrial hemp as otherwise provided by California Food and Agriculture Code sections 81000 - 81011 by "established agricultural research institutions" or others within the unincorporated area of the County of Humboldt. The moratorium extension is in effect for one year after enactment, and may be extended by further action by the Board of Supervisors within that time period for a total of up to two years. A four-fifths vote is required for adoption of any extension.
