Contractor's Response to Labor Costs



To Whom It May Concern,

I am writing in hopes that this will clear up any questions or concerns in regards to the May 2022 abatement clean up of 7218 Summit Ridge Dr. Eureka, CA 95503.

In regards to the 27.5 hours of labor billed to the job some of the things that can accrue in a California work day are as follows:

- One fifteen-minute break every two hours in a day (mandatory California law).
- One thirty-minute lunch (mandatory California law).
- Stopping the work to plan the next area to clean up to minimize disturbance to land owner and her personal property.
- The crew was held up on multiple instances by the land owner's son in protest of the work being done as follows; 5/23 for an hour and a half times three guys. 5/27 thirty minutes held up while the owner's son's dog attacked and bit one employee's ankles, **no charges pressed to date**, one guy. 5/31 two-two and a half hours for two guys while land owner's son protested the last days work and held up the loading and hauling of the materials that were brought back before job was done.

All totaled up this fourteen hours of time is billable and is most certainly out of the contractor's control.
