

**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
BY AND BETWEEN
COUNTY OF HUMBOLDT
AND
EEL RIVER CLEAN-UP PROJECT
FOR FISCAL YEAR 2019-2020**

This Memorandum of Understanding (“MOU”), entered into this ____ day of _____, 2019, by and between the County of Humboldt, a political subdivision of the State of California, hereinafter referred to as “COUNTY,” and the Eel River Clean-Up Project, a non-profit service organization, hereinafter referred to as “ERCP,” is made upon the following considerations:

WHEREAS, California Government Code Section 26227 provides that the board of supervisors of any county may appropriate and expend money from the county’s general fund to finance programs deemed to be necessary to meet the social needs of the population of the county, including, without limitation, the areas of health, law enforcement and public safety; and

WHEREAS, COUNTY placed a one-half (.5) cent local sales and use tax measure, known as “Measure Z,” on the November 2014 ballot to maintain and improve essential services; and

WHEREAS, Measure Z was passed by the voters of Humboldt County on November 4, 2014 and became operative on April 1, 2015; and

WHEREAS, due to the passage of Measure Z, COUNTY has additional funding to maintain and improve essential services, including, without limitation: law enforcement services; emergency response services; illegal cannabis cultivation enforcement and prevention; child abuse enforcement and prevention; crime investigation and prosecution; substance abuse rehabilitation; mental health treatment; rural fire protection, road repairs; and other necessary services relating to the areas of health, law enforcement and public safety; and

WHEREAS, COUNTY created a nine (9) member Citizens Advisory Committee to review Measure Z funding applications and make recommendations to the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors; and

WHEREAS, on or about February 14, 2019, ERCP submitted a Measure Z application, which is attached hereto as Exhibit A – Application for Measure Z Funding – and incorporated herein by reference as if set forth in full, to the Citizens’ Advisory Committee requesting an allocation in the amount of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) for the purpose of covering the costs and expenses associated with paying biweekly dump fees and purchasing equipment, fuel and other general supplies needed for trash collection, volunteer recruitment and community outreach.

WHEREAS, on April 16, 2019, the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors approved the Measure Z application submitted by ERCP in the amount of Two Thousand One Hundred Dollars (\$2,100.00) through June 30, 2020; and

WHEREAS, COUNTY and ERCP desire to enter into an agreement which sets forth each party’s rights and responsibilities regarding the expenditure of Measure Z funds allocated to ERCP.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, and of the mutual promises contained herein, the parties hereto agree as follows:

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1. COUNTY OBLIGATIONS:

COUNTY shall provide ERCP with an amount not to exceed Two Thousand One Hundred Dollars (\$2,100.00) for the purpose of covering the costs and expenses associated with paying biweekly dump fees and purchasing equipment, fuel and other general supplies needed for trash collection, volunteer recruitment and community outreach.

2. ERCP OBLIGATIONS:

- A. General Requirements. ERCP shall use the Measure Z funds allocated pursuant to the terms of this MOU to pay biweekly dump fees and purchase equipment, fuel and other general supplies needed for trash collection, volunteer recruitment and community outreach.
- B. Quarterly and Final Reports. ERCP shall provide quarterly and final reports to COUNTY as set forth in Exhibit B – Quarterly and Final Summary Reports – which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as if set forth in full. Any and all quarterly and final reports required hereunder shall be prepared using COUNTY’s standard Measure Z report form, which is attached hereto as Exhibit C – Quarterly and Final Report Form – and incorporated herein by reference as if set forth in full.
- C. Social Media. ERCP shall post summaries of the information contained in the quarterly and final reports submitted pursuant to the terms and conditions of this MOU on ERCP-maintained social media accounts as set forth in Exhibit D – Social Media Reporting Requirements – which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as if set forth in full. For purposes of this MOU, the term social media includes, without limitation, Facebook, Twitter, Instagram and Snapchat.
- D. Recognition of Measure Z Funding. ERCP shall cooperate with COUNTY efforts to recognize Measure Z funding. Such recognition may take the form of press releases, photos and adhesives to equipment.

3. TERM:

This MOU shall begin on July 1, 2019 and shall remain in full force and effect until June 30, 2020, unless sooner terminated as provided herein.

4. TERMINATION:

- A. Termination for Cause. COUNTY may, in its sole discretion, immediately terminate this MOU, if ERCP fails to adequately fulfill its obligations hereunder within the time limits specified herein, fails to comply with the terms or conditions set forth herein, or violates any local, state or federal law, regulation or standard applicable to its performance hereunder.
- B. Termination without Cause. COUNTY may terminate this MOU without cause upon thirty (30) days advance written notice which states the effective date of the termination.
- C. Termination due to Insufficient Funding. COUNTY’s obligations under this MOU are contingent upon the availability of local funding resulting from the sales and use tax established by Measure Z. In the event such funding is reduced or eliminated, COUNTY shall, in its sole discretion, determine whether this MOU shall be terminated. COUNTY shall provide ERCP seven (7) days advance written notice of its intent to terminate this MOU due to insufficient funding.

D. Compensation upon Termination. In the event this MOU is terminated, ERCP shall be entitled to compensation for uncompensated costs and expenses incurred hereunder through and including the effective date of such termination. However, this provision shall not limit or reduce any damages owed to COUNTY due to a breach of this MOU by ERCP.

5. COMPENSATION:

A. Maximum Amount Payable. The maximum amount payable by COUNTY for the costs and expenses incurred pursuant to the terms and conditions of this MOU is Two Thousand One Hundred Dollars (\$2,100.00). ERCP agrees to perform all of its obligations hereunder for an amount not to exceed such maximum dollar amount. However, if the allocation of local funding resulting from the sales and use tax established by Measure Z is reduced or eliminated, COUNTY may, by amendment, reduce the maximum amount payable hereunder, or terminate this MOU as provided herein.

B. Schedule of Rates. ERCP shall set forth the specific rates and costs applicable to this MOU using COUNTY's standard Measure Z budget form, which is attached hereto as Exhibit E – Schedule of Rates – and incorporated herein by reference as if set forth in full.

C. Additional Costs and Expenses. Any additional costs and expenses not otherwise provided for herein shall not be incurred by ERCP, or compensated by COUNTY, without written authorization by COUNTY. Any and all unauthorized costs and expenses incurred above the maximum payable amount set forth herein shall be the responsibility of ERCP. ERCP shall notify COUNTY, in writing, at least six (6) weeks prior to the date upon which ERCP estimates that the maximum payable amount will be reached.

6. PAYMENT:

ERCP shall submit to COUNTY quarterly invoices itemizing all costs and expenses incurred pursuant to the terms and conditions of this MOU. Invoices shall be in the format set forth in Exhibit F – Measure Z Invoice Form – which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as if set forth in full. ERCP shall submit a final undisputed invoice for payment within thirty (30) days following the expiration or termination of this MOU. Payment for the costs and expenses incurred hereunder shall be made within thirty (30) days after the receipt of approved invoices. Any and all invoices submitted ERCP shall be sent to COUNTY at the following address:

7. NOTICES:

Any and all notices required to be given pursuant to the terms and conditions of this MOU shall be in writing and either served personally or sent by certified mail, return receipt requested, to the respective addresses set forth below. Notice shall be effective upon actual receipt or refusal as shown on the receipt obtained pursuant to the foregoing.

8. RECORD RETENTION AND INSPECTION:

- A. Maintenance and Preservation of Records. ERCP agrees to timely prepare accurate and complete financial, performance and payroll records, documents and other evidence relating to the costs and expenses incurred pursuant to the terms and conditions of this MOU, and to maintain and preserve said records for at least three (3) years from the date of final payment hereunder, except that if any litigation, claim, negotiation, audit or other action is pending, the records shall be retained until completion and resolution of all issues arising therefrom. Such records shall be original entry books with a general ledger itemizing all debits and credits for the costs and expenses incurred pursuant to the terms and conditions of this MOU.
- B. Inspection of Records. Pursuant to California Government Code Section 8546.7, all records, documents, conditions and activities of ERCP, and its subcontractors, related to the costs and expenses incurred pursuant to the terms and conditions of this MOU, shall be subject to the examination and audit of the California State Auditor and any other duly authorized agents of the State of California for a period of three (3) years after the date of final payment hereunder. ERCP hereby agrees to make all such records available during normal business hours to inspection, audit and reproduction by COUNTY and any other duly authorized local, state and/or federal agencies. ERCP further agrees to allow interviews of any of its employees who might reasonably have information related to such records by COUNTY and any other duly authorized local, state and/or federal agencies. All examinations and audits conducted hereunder shall be strictly confined to those matters connected with the performance of this MOU, including, without limitation, the costs of administering this MOU.
- C. Audit Costs. In the event of an audit exception or exceptions related to the costs and expenses incurred pursuant to the terms and conditions of this MOU, the party responsible for not meeting the requirements set forth herein shall be responsible for the deficiency and for the cost of such audit. If the allowable expenditures cannot be determined because ERCP's documentation is nonexistent or inadequate, according to generally accepted accounting practices, the questionable cost shall be disallowed by COUNTY.

9. MONITORING:

ERCP agrees that COUNTY has the right to monitor any and all activities related to this MOU, including, without limitation, the right to review and monitor ERCP's records, policies, procedures and overall business operations, at any time, in order to ensure compliance with the terms and conditions of this MOU. ERCP will cooperate with a corrective action plan, if deficiencies in ERCP's records, policies, procedures or overall performance hereunder are identified by COUNTY. However, COUNTY is not responsible, and shall not be held accountable, for overseeing or evaluating the adequacy of ERCP's performance hereunder.

10. CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION:

- A. Disclosure of Confidential Information. In the performance of this MOU, ERCP may receive information that is confidential under local, state or federal law. ERCP hereby agrees to protect all confidential information in conformance with any and all applicable local, state and federal laws, regulations, policies, procedures and standards, including, without limitation: California

Welfare and Institutions Code Sections 827, 5328, 10850 and 14100.2; California Health and Safety Code Sections 1280.15 and 1280.18; the California Information Practices Act of 1977; the California Confidentiality of Medical Information Act (“CMIA”); the United States Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health Act (“HITECH Act”); the United States Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (“HIPAA”) and any current and future implementing regulations promulgated thereunder, including, but not limited to, the Federal Privacy Regulations contained in Title 45 of the Code of Federal Regulations (“C.F.R.”) Parts 160 and 164, the Federal Security Standards contained in 45 C.F.R. Parts 160, 162 and 164 and the Federal Standards for Electronic Transactions contained in 45 C.F.R. Parts 160 and 162, all as may be amended from time to time.

- B. Continuing Compliance with Confidentiality Requirements. Each party hereby acknowledges that local, state and federal laws, regulations and standards pertaining to confidentiality, electronic data security and privacy are rapidly evolving and that amendment of this MOU may be required to ensure compliance with such developments. Each party agrees to promptly enter into negotiations concerning an amendment to this MOU embodying written assurances consistent with the requirements of HIPAA, the HITECH Act, the CMIA and any other applicable local, state and federal laws, regulations or standards.

11. NON-DISCRIMINATION COMPLIANCE:

- A. Professional Services and Employment. In connection with the execution of this MOU, ERCP, and its subcontractors, shall not unlawfully discriminate in the provision of professional services or against any employee or applicant for employment because of: race; religion or religious creed; color; age (over forty (40) years of age); sex, including, without limitation, gender identity and expression, pregnancy, childbirth and related medical conditions; sexual orientation, including, without limitation, heterosexuality, homosexuality and bisexuality; national origin; ancestry; marital status; medical condition, including, without limitation, cancer and genetic characteristics; mental or physical disability, including, without limitation, HIV status and AIDS; political affiliation; military service; denial of family care leave; or any other classifications protected by any applicable local, state or federal laws, regulations or standards. Nothing herein shall be construed to require employment of unqualified persons.
- B. Compliance with Anti-Discrimination Laws. ERCP further assures that it, and its subcontractors, will abide by the applicable provisions of: Title VI and Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964; Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973; the Age Discrimination Act of 1975; the Food Stamp Act of 1977; Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990; the California Fair Employment and Housing Act; California Civil Code Sections 51, *et seq.*; California Government Code Sections 4450, *et seq.*; California Welfare and Institutions Code Section 10000; Division 21 of the California Department of Social Services Manual of Policies and Procedures; United States Executive Order 11246, as amended and supplemented by United States Executive Order 11375 and 41 C.F.R. Part 60; and any other applicable local, state and/or federal laws, regulations and standards, all as may be amended from time to time. The applicable regulations of the California Fair Employment and Housing Commission implementing California Government Code Section 12990, set forth in Sections 8101, *et seq.* of Title 2 of the California Code of Regulations, are incorporated herein by reference as if set forth in full.

12. NUCLEAR-FREE HUMBOLDT COUNTY ORDINANCE COMPLIANCE:

By executing this MOU, ERCP certifies that it is not a Nuclear Weapons Contractor, in that ERCP is not knowingly or intentionally engaged in the research, development, production or testing of nuclear warheads, nuclear weapons systems or nuclear weapons components as defined by the Nuclear-Free

Humboldt County Ordinance. ERCP agrees to notify COUNTY immediately if it becomes a Nuclear Weapons Contractor. COUNTY may immediately terminate this MOU if it determines that the foregoing certification is false or if ERCP subsequently becomes a Nuclear Weapons Contractor.

13. INDEMNIFICATION:

- A. Hold Harmless, Defense and Indemnification. ERCP shall hold harmless, defend and indemnify COUNTY and its agents, officers, officials, employees and volunteers from and against any and all claims, demands, losses, damages, liabilities, expenses and costs of any kind or nature, including, without limitation, attorney's fees and other costs of litigation, arising out of, or in connection with, ERCP's negligent performance of, or failure to comply with, any of the duties and/or obligations contained herein, except such loss or damage which was caused by the sole negligence or willful misconduct of COUNTY.
- B. Effect of Insurance. Acceptance of the insurance required by this MOU shall not relieve ERCP from liability under this provision. This provision shall apply to all claims for damages related to ERCP's performance hereunder, regardless of whether any insurance is applicable or not. The insurance policy limits set forth herein shall not act as a limitation upon the amount of indemnification or defense to be provided by ERCP hereunder.

14. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS:

This MOU shall not be executed by COUNTY, and ERCP is not entitled to any rights hereunder, unless certificates of insurance, or other sufficient proof that the following provisions have been complied with, are filed with the Clerk of the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors.

- A. General Insurance Requirements. Without limiting ERCP's indemnification obligations set forth herein, ERCP, and its subcontractors hereunder, shall take out and maintain, throughout the entire term of this MOU, and any extensions thereof, the following policies of insurance placed with insurers authorized to do business in the State of California and with a current A.M. Bests rating of no less than A: VII or its equivalent against personal injury, death and property damage which may arise from, or in connection with, the activities of ERCP and its agents, officers, directors, employees, assignees or subcontractors:
1. Comprehensive or Commercial General Liability Insurance at least as broad as Insurance Services Office Commercial General Liability Coverage (occurrence form CG 0001), in an amount of Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) per occurrence for any one (1) incident, including, without limitation, personal injury, death and property damage. If a general aggregate limit is used, such limit shall apply separately hereto or shall be twice the required occurrence limit.
 2. Automobile/Motor Liability Insurance with a limit of liability of no less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) combined single limit coverage. Such insurance shall include coverage of all owned, hired and non-owned vehicles, and be at least as broad as Insurance Service Office Form Code 1 (any auto).
 3. Workers' Compensation Insurance, as required by the California Labor Code, with statutory limits, and Employers Liability Insurance with a limit of no less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per accident for bodily injury or disease. Said policy shall contain, or be endorsed to contain, a waiver of subrogation against COUNTY and its agents, officers, officials, employees and volunteers.

4. Professional Liability Insurance – Error and Omission Coverage including coverage in an amount no less than Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) for each occurrence (Four Million Dollars (\$4,000,000.00) general aggregate). Said insurance shall be maintained for the statutory period during which ERCP may be exposed to liability regarding the performance of its obligations hereunder. ERCP shall require that such coverage be incorporated into its professional services agreements with any other entities.
- B. Special Insurance Requirements. Said policies shall, unless otherwise specified herein, be endorsed with the following provisions:
1. The Comprehensive or Commercial General Liability Policy shall provide that COUNTY, and its agents, officers, officials, employees and volunteers, are covered as additional insured for liability arising out of the operations performed by or on behalf of ERCP. The coverage shall contain no special limitations on the scope of protection afforded to COUNTY or its agents, officers, officials, employees and volunteers. Said policy shall also contain a provision stating that such coverage:
 - a. Includes contractual liability.
 - b. Does not contain exclusions as to property damage caused by explosion or collapse of structures or underground damage, commonly referred to as “XCU Hazards.”
 - c. Is the primary insurance with regard to COUNTY.
 - d. Does not contain a pro-rata, excess only and/or escape clause.
 - e. Contains a cross liability, severability of interest or separation of insureds clause.
 2. The above-referenced policies shall not be canceled, non-renewed or materially reduced in coverage without thirty (30) days prior written notice being provided to COUNTY in accordance with the notice requirements set forth herein. ERCP shall not terminate such coverage until COUNTY receives proof that equal or better insurance has been secured.
 3. The inclusion of more than one (1) insured shall not operate to impair the rights of one (1) insured against another insured, and the coverage afforded shall apply as though separate policies had been issued to each insured, but the inclusion of more than one (1) insured shall not operate to increase the limits of the insurer’s liability.
 4. For claims related to this MOU, ERCP’s insurance is the primary coverage to COUNTY, and any insurance or self-insurance programs maintained thereby are excess to ERCP’s insurance and will not be used to contribute therewith.
 5. Any failure to comply with the provisions of this MOU shall not affect the coverage provided to COUNTY or its agents, officers, officials, employees and volunteers.
 6. ERCP shall furnish COUNTY with certificates and original endorsements effecting the required coverage prior to execution of this MOU. The endorsements shall be on forms approved by the Humboldt County Risk Manager. Any deductible or self-insured retention over One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) shall be disclosed to, and approved by, COUNTY. If ERCP does not keep all required policies in full force and effect, COUNTY may, in addition to any other available remedies, take out the necessary insurance and deduct the cost of said insurance from the monies owed to ERCP under this MOU.

7. COUNTY is to be notified immediately if twenty-five percent (25%) or more of any required insurance aggregate limit is encumbered, and ERCP shall be required to purchase additional coverage to meet the above-referenced aggregate limits.

C. Insurance Notices. Any and all insurance notices required to be given hereunder shall be sent to the addresses set forth below in accordance with the notice requirements contained herein.

15. RELATIONSHIP OF PARTIES:

It is understood that this MOU is by and between two (2) independent entities and is not intended to, and shall not be construed to, create the relationship of agent, servant, employee, partnership, joint venture, or any other similar association. Both parties further agree that ERCP shall not be entitled to any benefits to which COUNTY employees are entitled, including, without limitation, overtime, retirement, leave or workers' compensation benefits. ERCP shall be solely responsible for the acts or omissions of its agents, officers, employees, assignees and subcontractors.

16. COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE LAWS, REGULATIONS AND STANDARDS:

A. General Legal Requirements. ERCP agrees to comply with any and all local, state and federal laws, regulations, policies, procedures and standards applicable to its performance hereunder.

B. Licensure Requirements. ERCP agrees to comply with any and all local, state and federal licensure, certification and accreditation requirements applicable to its performance hereunder.

C. Accessibility Requirements. ERCP agrees to comply with any and all applicable accessibility requirements set forth in the Americans with Disabilities Act, Section 508 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, California Government Code Section 1135 and any current and future implementing regulations, policies, procedures and standards promulgated thereunder, including, without limitation, the federal accessibility standards set forth in 36 C.F.R. Section 1194.1, all as may be amended from time to time.

D. Conflict of Interest Requirements. ERCP agrees to comply with any and all applicable conflict of interest requirements set forth in the California Political Reform Act and any current and future implementing regulations, policies, procedures and standards promulgated thereunder, including, without limitation, the County of Humboldt's Conflict of Interest Code, all as may be amended from time to time.

17. PROVISIONS REQUIRED BY LAW:

This MOU is subject to any additional local, state and federal restrictions, limitations or conditions that may affect the terms, conditions or funding of this MOU. This MOU shall be read and enforced as though all legally required provisions are included herein, and if for any reason any such provision

is not included, or is not correctly stated, the parties agree to amend the pertinent section to make such insertion or correction.

18. REFERENCE TO LAWS, REGULATIONS AND STANDARDS:

In the event any law, regulation or standard referred to herein is amended during the term of this MOU, the parties agree to comply with the amended provision as of the effective date thereof.

19. SEVERABILITY:

If any provision of this MOU, or any portion thereof, is found by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unenforceable or invalid for any reason, such provision shall be severable and shall not in any way impair the enforceability of any other provision of this MOU.

20. ASSIGNMENT:

Neither party shall delegate its duties nor assign its rights hereunder, either in whole or in part, without the other party's prior written consent. Any assignment by either party in violation of this provision shall be void, and shall be cause for immediate termination of this MOU. This provision shall not be applicable to service agreements or other arrangements usually or customarily entered into by either party to obtain supplies, technical support or professional services.

21. AGREEMENT SHALL BIND SUCCESSORS:

All provisions of this MOU shall be fully binding upon, and inure to the benefit of, the parties and to each of their heirs, executors, administrators, successors and permitted assigns.

22. WAIVER OF DEFAULT:

The waiver by either party of any breach of this MOU shall not be deemed to be a waiver of any such breach in the future, or of the breach of any other requirement of this MOU. In no event shall any payment by COUNTY constitute a waiver of any breach of this MOU which may then exist on the part of ERCP. Nor shall such payment impair or prejudice any remedy available to COUNTY with respect to any breach or default. COUNTY shall have the right to demand repayment of, and ERCP shall promptly refund, any funds disbursed to ERCP which COUNTY determines were not expended in accordance with the terms of this MOU.

23. AMENDMENT:

This MOU may be amended at any time during the term of this MOU upon the mutual consent of both parties. No addition to, or alteration of, the terms of this MOU shall be valid unless made in writing and signed by the parties hereto.

24. NON-LIABILITY OF COUNTY OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES:

No official or employee of COUNTY shall be personally liable for any default or liability under this MOU.

25. STANDARD OF PRACTICE:

ERCP warrants that it has the degree of learning and skill ordinarily possessed by reputable professionals practicing in similar localities in the same profession and under similar circumstances.

ERCP's duty is to exercise such care, skill and diligence as professionals engaged in the same profession ordinarily exercise under like circumstances.

26. TITLE TO INFORMATION AND DOCUMENTS:

It is understood that any and all documents, information and reports concerning the subject matter of this MOU prepared and/or submitted by ERCP shall become the property of COUNTY. However, ERCP may retain copies of such documents, information and reports for its records. In the event this MOU is terminated, for any reason whatsoever, ERCP shall promptly turn over all such documents, information and reports to COUNTY without exception or reservation.

27. JURISDICTION AND VENUE:

This MOU shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California. Any dispute arising hereunder, or relating hereto, shall be litigated in the State of California and venue shall lie in the County of Humboldt unless transferred by court order pursuant to California Code of Civil Procedure Sections 394 or 395.

28. ADVERTISING AND MEDIA RELEASE:

Any and all informational material related to this MOU shall receive approval from COUNTY prior to being used as advertising or released to the media, including, without limitation, television, radio, newspapers and internet. COUNTY shall provide to ERCP suggested language, and a Measure Z Logo, for all press releases. In addition, ERCP shall inform COUNTY of all requests for interviews by media related to this MOU before such interviews take place; and COUNTY is entitled to have a representative present at such interviews. All notices required by this provision shall be given to the Humboldt County Administrative Officer in accordance with the notice requirements set forth herein.

29. SURVIVAL OF PROVISIONS:

The duties and obligations of the parties set forth in Section 4(D) – Compensation upon Termination, Section 8 – Record Retention and Inspection, Section 10 – Confidential Information and Section 13 – Indemnification shall survive the expiration or termination of this MOU.

30. CONFLICTING TERMS OR CONDITIONS:

In the event of any conflict in the terms or conditions set forth in any other agreements in place between the parties hereto and the terms and conditions set forth in this MOU, the terms and conditions set forth herein shall have priority.

31. INTERPRETATION:

This MOU, as well as its individual provisions, shall be deemed to have been prepared equally by both of the parties hereto, and shall not be construed or interpreted more favorably for one (1) party on the basis that the other party prepared it.

32. INDEPENDENT CONSTRUCTION:

The titles of the sections and subsections set forth herein are inserted for convenience of reference only and shall be disregarded in construing or interpreting any of the provisions of this MOU.

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33. FORCE MAJEURE:

Neither party hereto shall be liable or responsible for delays or failures in performance resulting from events beyond the reasonable control, and without the fault or negligence, of such party. Such events shall include, without limitation, acts of God, strikes, lockouts, riots, acts of war, epidemics, acts of government, fire, power failures, nuclear accidents, earthquakes, unusually severe weather, acts of terrorism or other disasters, whether or not similar to the foregoing.

34. ENTIRE AGREEMENT:

This MOU contains all of the terms and conditions agreed upon by the parties hereto and no other agreements, oral or otherwise, regarding the subject matter of this MOU shall be deemed to exist or to bind either of the parties hereto. In addition, this MOU shall supersede in their entirety any and all prior agreements, promises, representations, understandings and negotiations of the parties, whether oral or written, concerning the same subject matter. Any and all acts which may have already been consummated pursuant to the terms and conditions of this MOU are hereby ratified.

35. COUNTERPART EXECUTION:

This MOU, and any amendments hereto, may be executed in one (1) or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original and all of which, when taken together, shall be deemed to be one (1) and the same agreement. A signed copy of this MOU, and any amendments hereto, transmitted by email or by other means of electronic transmission shall be deemed to have the same legal effect as delivery of an original executed copy of this MOU and any amendments hereto.

36. AUTHORITY TO EXECUTE:

Each person executing this MOU represents and warrants that he or she is duly authorized and has legal authority to execute and deliver this MOU. Each party represents and warrants to the other that the execution and delivery of this MOU and the performance of such party's obligations hereunder have been duly authorized.

We receive a \$2500 stipend from Humboldt County Public Works that pays for about a third of our dump fees every year. The rest of our funding comes mainly from a barbecue dinner/dance fundraiser we put on in the July at the Garberville Town Square in July; a raffle of an electric-assist, mountain bike; and random donations from community members throughout the year and we received a \$1000 Humboldt Area

Foundation grant this past year. Our core group of volunteers, including ourselves, consists of retirees. Donations went down last year. We are requesting \$3000 to make up the shortfall in funding due to our changing economy. Last year, our operating budget was \$9,440.



Measure Z Proposal Narrative for Eel River Clean-up Project

Twice a week, since October 25th, 2011, Michael Miller, a retired Viet Nam vet, has been picking up trash from various sites in and around the Garberville/Redway area as a volunteer. The pick-up sites include the Garberville Cemetary; DeMulling Veterans Park; "Camps A & B", two homeless camps located next to the Sprowel Creek Road exit from Hwy 101; under the Southern Humboldt bridges; and from homeless camps and trailheads located along Redwood Drive between Garberville and Dean Creek. Generally it's just Michael and two or three other regular volunteers, including Paul Turner and Dennis Lewis, who like Michael, are retired residents. They pick up trash and recyclables from both abandoned and occupied camps, that would otherwise have been left littered all over the ground, and much of it would have eventually washed down into the Eel River.

At the occupied homeless camps, they pass out trash bags to the campers and ask them to leave their filled bags at the trailheads of their camps, which ERCP then collects the next time they are in town. In addition to these twice-weekly clean-ups, every 6 months, in Spring and Fall, Recology donates the use of a 20 yard dumpster for our community-wide clean-ups that we publicize asking for volunteers. Fifteen to twenty hardy volunteers join us for those clean-ups and we generally collect 4000 to 5000lbs each time. We also ask the community for help occasionally for large clean-ups we find. For example 14 volunteers joined us to clean up a vacated campsite under the bridge over Eel River leading to the Redway Transfer Station operated by Recology. That special clean-up netted us 4500lbs of trash. Recology waived the dump fees for that operation. All together, over the last 7 1/2 years, we collected approximately 600,000 lbs of trash that, if not for the efforts of ERCP, would still be littering our landscapes and filling up the Eel River.

We feel this has been a worthwhile community-supported effort that we've been proud to lead. Eel River Clean-up Project has been supported by our community through donations, from the trash bags donated by Dazey's Supply, to the many donations from community members. The \$2500 stipend from Humboldt County Public Works and the \$1000 donation granted by Humboldt Area Foundation have also been greatly appreciated. Due to the present economic slump in Humboldt County, donations have gone down somewhat in the last year, which is why we are applying for Measure Z funding to carry on. Thank you to the Measure Z Committee for your attention to our request.

From the beginning, the Eel River Clean-up Project has always been able to pay our bills through donations from the Southern Humboldt community and the \$2500 stipend we received from Humboldt County Public Works.

This year, due to the economic downturn in Southern Humboldt, we could see that community donations were down and so we held a raffle and fundraising party in the Garberville Town Square and applied for a grant from Humboldt Area Foundation. We are asking for \$3000 in Measure Z funds to address the shortfall in donations. We currently run on a budget of just under \$10,000 per year.
