Hello,

I am happy to hear that a bike lane is proposed for Washington Ave. There is a lot of development going on at that location. The new housing development and the future park will increase traffic. At the same time, more bike traffic as well so I am supportive of creating a safe bike lane for all travelers.

I live on Dena Dr. and ride my bike daily. It has always been scary to ride on Washington without any bike lane. The corner of Washington and School Road is a particularly dangerous intersection because there is very little leeway on Washington and on School facing west at the stop sign. Recently they installed a ramp at the north east corner but it has unfinished edges creating an uneven surface for both cars and bicycles on this tight corner.

I wasn't clear about the parking suggestions from the map but my concern is being able to exit from Dena and Worth (and possibly the parking area of the BMX park if it has access to Washington) with a clear view of traffic. I don't want it to become like downtown Arcata where you have to go halfway into the lane just to see if it is clear.

There will also be random influx of parking needs when the BMX park is opened. I am not clear how that will work.

I also have concerns for this area in regards to speed of traffic. I know that some roads (like Linda and Heartwood) have installed speed bumps to slow traffic. Might that also be considered for this area?

BTW - I only found out about this by reading the Mad River Union. This surprised me because it does impact my neighborhood directly.

Thank you for inviting additional input on the above plan. For reference, our house is located near the juncture of Washington and McKinleyville Avenues. Per your "diagram 1" enclosure, the current plan is to make that stretch of Washington Avenue opposite our property and the next several neighbor's property a no parking zone. This would be a terrible mistake. There have already been multiple crashes due to cars coming off of McKinleyville Avenue, miscalculating the curve, hitting cars parked in front of our house and the neighbors' house and damaging additional property as they drove through hedges and front yards. Consequently we never park on the street in front of our house and the neighbors now park several of their vehicles across the street to avoid the possibility of additional damage. Another issue with making the area across the street from our property a no parking zone is that the space in front of our house would become blocked with parked cars which would greatly reduce visibility for safely entering and exiting our driveway. We now back into our driveway so we can face the street and see oncoming traffic from both directions when we exit the driveway. If cars are parked in front of our property we have to stop parallel to them in the middle of the street in order to back into our driveway. Having to do that puts us at risk of being hit by an inattentive driver coming around the corner too quickly. We hope you will take the time to come out to the area and see for yourself the problems with your current proposal on that stretch of Washington Avenue. Hello

I am a regular driver on this route from McK Ave- Washington- School Road. I don't pups like to strongly express my concern for one additional area where I regularly see Driver's cross the center line, due to parked cars- which will undoubtedly be more dangerous with bike lanes added (for bikers, pedestrians and drivers).

This area is along the curve by Oakdale Drive. You have addressed the west side of the curve, however the east side is where I see more cars cross the created line, going head on into cars traveling from Mck Ave toward School Rd. This is also a regular dangerous situation with the new crosswalk added on that curve.

I would strongly suggest two additional safety adjustments:

- 1) remove street parking on BOTH sides of this curve
- 2) add the flashing light signal for pedestrians crossing (you can't see them on the curve especially when hidden by parked cars and RV's

I will attach a photo with my additional concerned part of the curve marked.

In all honestly have never let my kids ride bikes, or walk dogs in this direction due to the cars speeding along this curve as well as where Washington curves into McK Ave. Due to unsafe speeds AND drivers drifting down ver the center lines in both. I would also note, Driver's regularly blow through the stop signs on School Road, they often don't even slow down where Washington is... perhaps flags on those stop signs could help. I am very concerned we will see a biker or pedestrian hit in these areas, especially when the bmx park brings more people on foot, bikes, and cars. Thank you, Anne
