DISCUSSION:

In 1996, the Humboldt County Child Abuse Services Team (C.A.S.T.) was established as a Multidisciplinary Team Response that includes agencies involved in the investigation, intervention, and ongoing treatment of child abuse. This team approach brings existing resources together, in an effort to more effectively and efficiently respond to and resolve child abuse cases. On September 27, 2005, the first Memorandum of Understanding was approved by the Board of Supervisors to articulate Department of Health and Human Services' funding of the Child Abuse Services Team and the District Attorney Office's responsibility to provide staffing. The Memorandum of Understanding approved on September 27, 2005 has a term that may automatically renew annually, if neither party of the Agreement provides written notice of its intention to not renew the Agreement.

With the execution of this new Agreement, the term would be modified to terminate on June 30, 2011 with the option to extend the Agreement for two (2), one-year (1-year) terms. Additionally, the Department of Health and Human Services and the District Attorney's office have collaborated to further articulate in this new Memorandum of Understanding the information to be included in the quarterly invoices provided by the District Attorney Office's for C.A.S.T.

With the execution of this agreement, the Department of Health and Human Services would like to continue to provide funding for the Child Abuse Services Team, which provides a coordinated and collaborative interagency communication of important details and has proven successful in the criminal investigation and prosecution of child abuse cases.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The \$280,000 for the District Attorney Office's participation with the Child Abuse Services Team has been budgeted in the adopted 2010 – 2011 Fiscal Year Budget in the 1160 fund budget unit 508.

ALTERNATIVES TO STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

The Board of Supervisors may choose to not approve this recommendation. This is not recommended as the Department of Health and Human Services feels that this funding is critical in providing an effective and efficient response and resolution to child abuse cases.
