Subject: Women, Infants and Children (WIC) Funding Application from the California Department of Public Health (CDPH).

RECOMMENDATION(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Approves and authorize the Public Health Director to submit the application for WIC funding in the amount of \$4,311,734 for the period of October 1, 2015 through September 30, 2019.
2. Authorizes the Public Health Director to sign the Certification of Contract Application.
3. Authorizes the Public Health Director to sign the final WIC agreement when it is received from CDPH.
4. Authorizes the Public Health Director to sign WIC agreement amendments for FY 2015-16, FY 2016-17, FY 2017-18 and FY 2018-19 when they are received from CDPH.
5. Directs the Clerk of the Board to return the certified agenda item to the Department of Health & Human Services (DHHS) Contracts Unit.

DISCUSSION:

The Board approved Agreement 14-10236 with CDPH for the DHHS – Public Health WIC Program on May 27, 2014 for the period of October 1, 2014 through September 30, 2015. The application before the Board today is the first step in the process to continue to provide WIC funding from October 1, 2015

through September 30, 2019 in the amount of \$4,311,734. WIC is federally funded; CDPH is responsible for administering these funds for local WIC programs.

The County of Humboldt has participated in the WIC program since 1976. WIC provides individualized nutrition counseling, breastfeeding support, vouchers to purchase healthy foods for low-income women and their children as well as referrals to health care providers and medical clinics. The target population includes women who are pregnant, breastfeeding or have recently delivered a baby as well as infants and children less than five years of age. DHHS – Public Health WIC serves approximately 3,700 clients a month.

Most State Standard Agreements require the certifications to be signed with the agreement; however, since CDPH WIC is 100% federally funded, the certificates are required with the application submission.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

There is no financial impact at this time. However, once the application is approved and results in a finalized agreement with CDPH WIC, Humboldt County WIC will be reimbursed for services up to a maximum of \$4,311,734 for the agreement period of October 1, 2015 through September 30, 2019. These funds were anticipated and included in the proposed fiscal year 2015-16 county budget.

The application before your Board today supports the Board's Strategic Framework by protecting vulnerable populations and providing community-appropriate levels of service.

ALTERNATIVES TO STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

Your Board could choose not to approve the application to CDPH for WIC funding. However, DHHS Public Health does not recommend this as the WIC program is federally funded and provides services to low-income families throughout the County of Humboldt.
