To the WCB Program Coordinator:

On behalf of the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors, I am writing to express our support for the City of Eureka's Martin Slough Streamflow Enhancement Project. Martin Slough is part of the Elk River complex, one of the largest rivers flowing into the Humboldt Bay. It has historically provided excellent habitat for Coho and Chinook salmon as well as many other aquatic species.

A lot of effort has been expended over the last few years in planning restoration projects for Martin Slough. Other sediment control and habitat improvement projects are ongoing in the larger Elk River watershed. This streamflow enhancement project is a crucial element of the City's and others' ongoing effort to restore habitat in Martin Slough and Elk River.

The Martin Slough Stream Flow Enhancement Project includes a forbearance program that will eliminate the impacts due to the pumping of irrigation water from the upper reaches of Martin Slough during the low flow period of the year when fish are present. An alternate supply of irrigation water will be provided by the installation of a 300' deep well and 400,000 gallon water storage reservoir. The alternate water supply and forbearance program will leave the water in the slough when it is most needed and will significantly benefit other ongoing restoration efforts.
