Hi Michael,

I reviewed the County's referral for the Russ Quarry CUP/SMP Renewal (PLN-2025-19390; APN 313-132-001) and have only one suggestion pertaining to revegetation. Rather than using invasive and non-native grasses and forbs in the seed mix, please consider a mix that incorporates native species, such as California brome (*Bromus carinatus*), blue wildrye (*Elymus glaucus*), California oatgrass (*Danthonia californica*), and tomcat clover (*Trifolium wildenovii*). A sterile hybrid would also be fine as a component of the seed mix since it provides rapid soil stabilization. You could consult the Reclamation Plan for other Public Works quarries, such as Degnen Hansen and Bald Hills, both of which propose suitable seed mixes.
