Re: APN 216-381-021

The following is an evaluation of potential timberland conversion on proposed cannabis cultivation sites and associated areas included in the Humboldt County Cannabis Permit Application for Joseph Bilandzija within APN 216-381-021. Please accept this letter as the RPF's written report required by Humboldt County Code, Ordinance No. 2559 (Commercial Medical Marijuana Land Use), Section 55.4.10 (j), sited below.

"Alternately, for existing operations occupying sites created through prior unauthorized conversion of timberland, if the landowner has not completed a civil or criminal process and/or entered into a negotiated settlement with CALFIRE, the applicant shall secure the services of a registered professional forester (RPF) to evaluate site conditions and conversion history for the property and provide a written report to the Planning Division containing the RPF's recommendation as to remedial actions necessary to bring the conversion area into compliance with provisions of the Forest Practices Act. The Planning Division shall provide CAL-FIRE written Notice of Availability of the RPF's report. If CAL-FIRE takes no action within ten (10) days of the notice of availability, the report recommendations shall become final."

Timberland Resource Consultants (TRC) inspected and evaluated the proposed cultivation sites and associated areas contained within the application on February 2, 2018. The RPF exercised due diligence in reviewing all sites and all available resources to fully assess potential timberland conversion. This report evaluates the cultivation sites and associated areas for timber operations only. All other land alteration such a grading, construction, and other permit-regulated activities do not fall within the scope of this report. All property features and sites unrelated to cultivation activities also do not fall within the scope of this report. All findings are summarized in the report below.

Project Summary

The property is a 10-acre parcel located in the Ranch Sequola subdivision southwest of the community of Alderpoint. Legal description is the SW 1/4 of the NW 1/4 of Section 5, Township 4S, Range 5E, Humboldt Base & Meridian. The property contains several cultivation sites as described below and numerous outbuildings and plastic water tanks. The greater property is densely forested with second growth tanoak, Pacific madrone, and Douglas-fir. Based upon increment borings of dominant Douglas-fir trees, the parcel appears to have been harvested (regenerated) approximately 60-70 years ago. Review of 1968 aerial imagery shows numerous truck roads, landings, and advanced regeneration suggestive of recent timber harvest +/- 10-15 years prior. No timber harvesting via a THP or NTMP have occurred since the original harvest, and none have been recorded by Cal Fire on 20-25 (Watershed Mapper property the past years http://egis.fire.ca.gov/watershed_mapper/). TRC prepared Conversion Exemption 1-15-EX389 HUM for the Applicant and former landowner, Joseph Bilandzija, which was approved by Cal Fire in December 2015. The areas converted via the permit are shown on the attached map. TRC also prepared a 10% Exemption 1-16-EX074 HUM, which covered the entire property, for the Applicant and former landowner, Joseph Bilandzija, which was approved by Cal Fire in March 2016. The current landowner, Canglomerate Inc., purchased the property from Joseph Bilandzija in January 2017. Joseph Bilandzija originally purchased the property in 2011.

Cultivation Site 1

The cultivation site encompasses an approximately 1.0-acre area, which historically consisted of a combination of full term/outdoor and mixed light cultivation. Per Baird Engineering's Site Plan, existing cannabis cultivation at Cultivation Site 1 consists of Greenhouse 1 (mixed light) at 1,360 ft2; Greenhouse 2 (mixed light) at 1,800 ft2; Greenhouse 3 (mixed light) at 1,600 ft2; and 6,000 ft2 of outdoor cultivation. Total cultivation at this site is 10,760 ft2. The site also contains 4 buildings and numerous water tanks. Review of 1968 aerial imagery reveals a large log landing was located at Cultivation Site 1. In 1998 the site was approximately half grown over with tanoak and Douglas-fir relative to 1968 conditions. Between 2005 and 2014 the site was slightly expanded, and between 2014 and 2016 the site was significantly expanded to the north by approximately 0.40 acres. On March 25, 2016 Cal Fire approved a "10% Exemption" (1-16-EX074 HUM), which included (1) harvesting dead, dying or diseased trees of any size in amounts less than 10 percent of the average volume per acre, and (2) harvesting fuelwood or split products in amounts less than 10 percent of the average volume per acre. See Cal Fire's Inspection Report (attached(regarding the use of this exemption permit within Cultivation Site 1. Despite the owner's attempt at compliance with the Forest Practice Rules via the submission of the 10% Exemption, conversion activities appear to have occurred. The cultivation activities observed at Cultivation Site 1 impede the use of this space for current timber growth and harvesting, and the landowner has effectively converted the single use of this space from timber production to cannabis cultivation. Thus, Cultivation Site 1 constitutes timberland conversion.

Cultivation Site 2

The cultivation site encompasses an approximately 1.3-acre area that was harvested and developed via Conversion Exemption 1-15-EX389 HUM. Per Baird Engineering's Site Plan, Cultivation Site 2 consists of two vegetable greenhouses totaling 3,840 ft² with no cannabis cultivation occurring. There are four proposed cannabis cultivation greenhouses totaling 4,740 ft². The site also contains a groundwater well and two 5,000-gallon water tanks and one 2,500-gallon water tank. Cultivation Site 2 was legally converted per 14CCR 1104.1, and Cal Fire issued a Final Completion for 1-15-EX389 HUM on November 3, 2017 with no violations observed.

Limitations and Considerations for Timberland Conversion Activities

Watercourses and Water Resources

14CCR 1104.1(a)(2)(F): "No timber operations are allowed within a watercourse and lake protection zone unless specifically approved by local permit (e.g., county, city)."

Cultivation Site 1: A small portion of the cultivation site is located within a Class II WLPZ. The slope steepness for the adjacent Class II watercourse ranges from 30-60%. Specifically, the segment of WLPZ southeast of the 776 ft² building is 75-feet and 100-feet for the balance of WLPZ to the northwest. This section of WLPZ was flagged by the RPF on February 2, 2018 with blue and white WLPZ ribbon. Humboldt County's Grading and Open Space Ordinance would have applied to this proposed conversion and would have required a 100-foot SMA (WLPZ).

The conversion within the WLPZ would not have been permitted by Cal Fire unless "specifically approved by local permit (e.g. County, City)" per 14CCR 1104.1(a)(2)(F).

Please note that per the Applicant's WRPP, all cannabis cultivation has been removed from within the 100-foot buffer along the Class II watercourse. Cultivation related material still remains in the 100-foot buffer, and needs to be removed. Erosion control has also been applied.

Cultivation Site 2: Conversion Exemption 1-15-EX389 HUM is no less than 100-feet from the Class II watercourse. The WLPZ and associated flagging was closely inspected by the RPF on February 2, 2018 to verify compliance. No cultivation activities at Cultivation Site 2 are occurring within the Class II's 100-foot buffer zone. The RPF "freshened" up the WLPZ flagging to increase awareness and future compliance.

Cultivation Site 3: Conversion Exemption 1-15-EX389 HUM is no less than 100-feet from the Class II watercourse. The WLPZ and associated flagging was closely inspected by the RPF on February 2, 2018 to verify compliance. No cultivation related activities at Cultivation Site 3 are occurring within the Class II's 100-foot buffer zone. The RPF "freshened" up the WLPZ flagging to increase awareness and future compliance.

Slash and Woody Debris Treatment

14CCR 1104.1(a)(2)(O)(6): "Full slash and woody debris treatment may include any of the following: a. burying: b. chipping and spreading; c. piling and burning; or d. removing slash and woody debris from the site for treatment in compliance with (a)-(b). Slash and woody debris may not be burned by open outdoor fires except under permit from the appropriate fire protection agency. if required, the local air pollution control district or air quality management district. The burning must occur on the property where the slash and woody debris originated."

No slash and/or woody debris from past timber operations or conversion activities were observed. As previously noted, Cal Fire issued a Final Completion for Conversion Exemption 1-15-EX389 HUM on November 3, 2017 and no violations were observed.

Biological Resources and Forest Stand Health

14 CCR 1104.1 (2)(H): "No sites of rare, threatened or endangered plants or animals shall be disturbed, threatened or damaged and no timber operations shall occur within the buffer zone of a sensitive species as defined in 14 CCR 895.1"

The California Natural Diversity Database (CNDDB) was queried in October 2015 in association with the preparation of Conversion Exemption 1-15-EX389 HUM. No observations of sensitive, rare, threatened, or endangered species or species of special concern were recorded in the CNDDB within the 0.7-mile biological assessment area surrounding the property. A query of the CNDDB NSO Database in October 2015 revealed no known Northern Spotted Owl (NSO) Activity Centers within the 0.7-mile biological assessment area surrounding the property.

The conversion areas did not include late successional stands, late seral stage forests, or old growth trees. The conversion area did not include any trees that existed before 1800 A.D and is greater than sixty (60) inches in diameter at stump height for Sierra or Coastal Redwoods, and forty-eight (48) inches in diameter at stump height for all other tree species.

Cultural Resources

14 CCR 1104.1 (2)(1): "No timber operations are allowed on significant historical or archeological sites."

In association with the preparation of Conversion Exemption 1-15-EX389 HUM, the RPF conducted pre-field research for the property's geographic location, and closely surveyed the sites and surrounding areas for presence or evidence of archeological or historic sites. This occurred in December 2015. The archaeological survey was conducted by Chris Carroll, a certified archaeological surveyor with current Cal Fire Archaeological Training (Archaeological Training Course # 57R). The survey consisted of examining boot scrapes, rodent disturbances, natural and manmade areas of exposed soils, and road and cultivation site surfaces. An additional survey occurred on February 2, 2018 for Cultivation Site #1 and no archeological sites were observed during the TRC field assessment.

Per 14 CCR 1104.1(2)(1), all required Native American tribes and organizations were notified of the project location. See copy of letters at:

Recommendations


In summary, a total of 3.1 acres of timberland conversion have occurred within the property. This acreage is above the three-acre conversion exemption maximum. The conversion activities at Cultivation Site #1 were unpermitted and occurred within the WLPZ. The conversion activities conducted on the property do *not* comply with the California Forest Practice Act and the California Forest Practice Rules. The RPF recommends the following measures for the converted areas:


1. Cultivation Site 1: The previously converted portion of the 100-foot WLPZ along the Class II watercourse shall be re-planted with Group A species (Douglas-fir and/or redwood) at no less than 435 trees per acre density (10-ft by 10-ft spacing). This area is shown on the attached map and equates to approximately 0.25 acres. Planting shall occur per the attached "Restocking Plan". The restocking of this area shall lower the total converted area to 2.85 acres, which is below the three-acre conversion exemption maximum.








Orthophoto Photo Date 2-3-2018 APN 216-381-021 Scale 1" ~ 85'

Regeneration Plan

<u>Site Preparation</u>: Site preparation is a widely used method to facilitate the establishment of a desirable stand of trees. Site preparation activities remove or reduce competing vegetation, reduce or remove unwanted trees and logging debris, and prepare the soil to promote the growth and survival of desired tree species. There are many methods of site preparation that fall under either chemical or mechanical site preparation. The primary objective is to have an area suitable for planting and establishing a new stand of trees. If heavy equipment is available, the RPF recommends subsoiling/ripping the planted sites. Subsoiling/ripping is a mechanical site prep method for heavy soils on cutover or agricultural lands that have a compacted layer at or below the soil surface that limits root growth and development. Subsoiling/ripping increases aeration and water-holding capacity of compacted soils and breaks up root restricting hardpans and/or traffic pans.

<u>Planting:</u> The RPF recommends planting redwood and/or Douglas-fir seedlings at a spacing no less than 10 feet by 10 feet or 435 trees per acre. If deer browsing is expected (landowner's local knowledge), then the density can be slightly increased to account for mortality and/or damage. The area to be planted is approximately 10,890 ft² in size, which shall require approximately 109 conifer seedlings to be planted.

<u>Seedlings</u>: Most conifer seedlings that come from the nursery are usually available in two forms; bareroot seedlings and containerized seedlings. Bareroot seedlings are essentially stock whose roots are exposed at the time of planting. Bareroot seedlings are grown in nursery seedbeds and lifted from the soil in which they are grown to be planted in the field. Containerized seedlings are grown in a variety of hard-walled vessels or in peat pots from seed. Given the conditions of the site and the higher survival rate associated with containerized stock, the RPF recommends using containerized seedlings if available. Seedling care and handling is extremely important to ensure post planting survival. For long-term storage (more than 3 days) store at 33-36 degrees Fahrenheit. For short-term storage (several hours to less than 3 days) store below 42 degrees Fahrenheit. At the planting site take care to not let the roots dry out and avoid exposure to the sun or warmer temperatures.

Planting Instructions:

- 1. Tree planting shall only occur in winter or early spring. Tree planting should not occur if the ground is frozen, or during unusually warm periods.
- Dig a hole at least one inch deeper and wider than the seedling roots. If planting from a container, dig the hole an inch deeper and wider than the container.
- 3. Place the seedling into the hole taking care not to bend the taproot, or main vertical root, and cover with soil.
- 4. Pack the soil down firmly around the seeding to remove any air pockets.
- 5. See Appendix A-D for illustrations for correct planting techniques.
- 6. The RPF recommends acquiring conifer seedlings from Green Diamond Resource Company's nursery in Korbel. Contact Glen Lehar @ 707-668-4439. Indicate the elevation and geographic area of the planting site and he will recommend the appropriate stock.

Timber operations shall comply with all other applicable provisions of the Forest Practice Act and regulations, county general plans, zoning ordinances, and any implementing ordinances; copies of the state rules and regulations may be found on CAL FIRE's Web Page on the Internet at http://www.fice.co.gov.

- All limber operations shall be complete within one year from the date of acceptance by CAL FIRE.

 All conversion activities shall be complete within two years from the date of acceptance by CAL FIRE unless under penalt by local jurisdiction. Failure to complete the conversion requires compliance with stocking standards and stocking report requirements of the Forest Practice Act
- and Board of Forestry and Fire Protection regulations.
 The timber operator shall remove or dispose of all slash or woody debris in accordance with 14 CCR § 1104.1(a)(2)(D)(1)-(9). The timberland owner may assume responsibility for the slash treatment, provided the landowner acknowledges in writing to CAL FIRE such responsibility at the time of submission of this notice. The specific requirements shall be included with the acknowledgement.

Timber operations may be conducted during the winter period. Tractor operations in the winter period are allowed under any of the conditions

- described in 14 CGR § 1104.1(a)(2)(E)1.-3.

 No timber operations are allowed within a watercourse and take protection zone unless specifically approved by local permit (e.g., county, city). No timber operations shall be conducted until CAL FIRE's notice of acceptance is received and a valid copy of this notice and CAL FIRE's acceptance shall be kept on site during timber operations.
- No siles of rare, threatened or endangered plants or animals or species of special concern shall be disturbed, threatened, or damaged.

No timber operations are allowed on significant historical or archeological sites.

- Within one month of the completion of limber operations, including stash disposal, the timberland owner shall submit a work completion report
- A violation of the conversion exemption, including a conversion applied for in the name of someone other than the person or entity implementing the conversion in bona fide good failth, are violations of the Forest Practice Act and penalties may accrue up to ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for each violation pursuant to Article 8 (commencing with Section 4601).

Project Description

This conversion proposes to convert timberland to agriculture and family and farm dwelling. Per the Humboldt County General Plan, the conversion exemption area is presently zoned Forest Recreation. For this particular zoning, timber production and recreation are the desirable predominant uses and agriculture is the secondary use. Family and farm dwellings and general agriculture are principally permitted uses per Humboldt County Zoning Reg Code 314-7.3. Humboldt County's Grading and Open Space Ordinance applies to this project and the County has reviewed and signed off on this project. See attachment from County.

The timberland owner has certified via his signature, under penalty of perjury, that this is a one-time conversion to agriculture and a family and farm dwelling. 


- Unless otherwise required, slash greater than one inch in diameter and greater than two feet long, and woody
 debris, except pine, shall receive full treatment no later than April 1 of the year following its creation, or within one
 year from the date of acceptance of the conversion exemption by the Director, whichever comes first.
- All pine slash three inches and greater in diameter and longer than four feet must receive initial treatment if it is still on the parcel, within 7 days of its creation.
- 3. All pine woody debris longer than four feet must receive an initial treatment prior to full treatment.
- 4. Initial treatment shall include limbing woody debris and cutting slash and woody debris into lengths of less than four feet, and leaving the pieces exposed to solar radiation to aid in rapid drying.
- Full treatment of all pine slash and woody debris must be completed by March 1 of the year following its creation, or within one year from the date of acceptance of the conversion exemption by the Director, whichever comes first.
- 6. Full slash and woody debris treatment may include any of the following:
 - a. Burying;
 - b. Chipping and spreading;
 - c. Piling and burning; or
 - d. Removing stash and woody debris from the site for treatment in compliance with (a)-(b). Stash and woody debris may not be burned by open outdoor fires except under permit from the appropriate fire protection agency, if required, the local air pollution control district or air quality management district. The burning must occur on the property where the stash and woody debris originated.
- 7. Slash and woody debris, except for pine, which is cut up for firewood shall be cut to lengths 24 inches or less and set aside for drying by April 1 of the year following its creation. Pine slash and woody debris which is cut up for firewood shall be cut to lengths 24 inches or less and set aside for drying within seven days of its creation.
- Any treatment which involves burning of slash or woody debris shall comply with all state and local fire and air quality rules.






