**PROCLAMATION  
OF THE  
BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

**WHEREAS**, national service participants demonstrate commitment, dedication, and patriotism by making an intensive commitment to service, a commitment that remains with them in their future endeavors; and

**WHEREAS**, the Corporation for National and Community Service is joining with the National League of Cities, National Association of Counties, Cities of Service, and mayors and county officials across the country in recognizing National Service Recognition Day.
