My name is Loren Pancoast. My wife, Susan and I live on Sprowl Creek road and the intersection of Old Briceland Road. My wife's parents purchased this in the early 1950's. She has lived on this property all of her life. Our only water source is a well on our property. We do not have access to city water – only our well. Every fall (Aug, Sept) our well has minimal output. Many times we run out of water n the fall.

We live 1200 feet from one of the proposed grow sites and about 1800 feet from the other.

We are scared to death what will happen when you start pulling 178.000 gallons of water out of this aquifer. We are on the same elevation and only 12-1800 feet away. Our water is so scarce around August - We would have no fire protection and no water for our family to live on.

What kind of recourse do we have when our water is gone? What is the county's legal responsibility?

I am totally against you permitting this grow because of how it will affect the surrounding neighbors.
