Remediation Plan for Vista 36, LLC APN: 316-312-008 RE:

This memorandum describes an environmental remediation plan for a preexisting cannabis cultivation site to be decommissioned located at APN 316-312-008.

MEMORANDUM SUMMARY

The development of a plan for cleanup and suppression of sedimentation from entering near by watercourses will require collaboration between the parties responsible for remediation and the approval from the County of Humboldt. The appropriate cleanup plan, and its implementation, depends upon the requirements of an approved plan for remediation of the Site To Be Decommissioned, referred to throughout this document as the Project Site (Appendix B: Map 1).

A conceptual approach for the preparation of site cleanup, a remediation plan, and an appropriate timeframe to complete this task is provided in this memorandum. The remediation approach described throughout this memorandum in conceptual, presenting a site cleanup and improvement plan based on:

- Existing information and current site conditions;
- The planned future use of the site;
- Experience with similar sites.

PROJECT SITE EXISTING CONDITIONS

The Project Site is located on Berry Summit, in the upper Willow Creek drainage, at an elevation between 2,800 and 3,000 feet in Humboldt County, California. The center location of the Project Site is 40°53'28.9"N 123°46'03.6"W.

A Less Than 3 Acre Conversion Exemption was accepted by the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (CAL FIRE) on April 2, 2015 for timber operations to be completed at the Project Site, which is the location that is currently being addressed for remediation (Appendix C: Timber Harvest Plan). The conversion occurred to convert timberland into agriculture. Per the Humboldt County General Plan, the conversion exemption area is zoned Unclassified with an agricultural general plan designation. Prior to the conversion of this site, the site consisted of merchantable even-aged Douglas-fir and tanoak. Prior to the conversion, CAL FIRE determined that "[t]he conversion exemption area's slopes and aspects [were] favorable for agriculture. The soils [were] inadequate for agriculture but grow medium is imported and therefore not a limiting factor," (Appendix C page 12). The timber harvest was conducted following a Winter Operation Plan to mitigate disturbance to the surrounding environment, watercourses, and other habitats as the time the harvest operation took place (Appendix C page 14).

Post conversion of the Project Site, the prior landowner began cultivating cannabis at this location at some point between the timber harvest operation ending and June 26, 2016, based on aerial imagery obtained from Google Earth Pro. Three (3) unpermitted structures were built at this time and are still currently constructed (Appendix A: Photo 1 & 2; Appendix B: Map 1).

PROJECT SITE CURRENT CONDITIONS

A site visit was conducted by Mason London, the principal biological consultant of Naiad Biological Consulting, and Greg Davis, a contracted wetland scientist with Naiad Biological Consulting, on October 30, 2020, between 1000 and 1200, as a measure to assess the current conditions of the Project Site.

The Project Site has not had cannabis cultivated during the 2020 season. Cultivation infrastructure and materials still exists within the project site, such as:

- built raised beds consisting of fence posts and plywood (Photo 3)
- Smart Pots filled with potting soil (Photo 4)
- Piles of scrap wood, pallets, and PVC piping used for greenhouse frames (Photo 5 & 6)
- Perlite (Photo 7)
- Three (3) unpermitted structures (Photo 1 & 2)

Since the Project Site location was graded in conjunction with the permitted 3 Acre Conversion Exemption, all slopes and topography appear to be adequate and there is no visible evidence of past or current erosion within or off site. The majority of the exposed ground is currently stabilized by forb and grass species, many of which are considered to be invasive. Some of these species include bull thistle (*Cirsium vulgare*), ribwort plantain (*Plantago lanceolate*), rough dog's-tail (*Cynosurus echinatus*), Sain John's wort (*Hypericum perforatum*), Italian thistle (*Carduus pycnocephalus*), chicory (*Cichorium intybus*), curly dock (*Rumex crispus*), cat's ear dandelion (*Hypochaeris radicata*) and others.

REMEDIATION RECOMMENDATIONS

- The Project Site is to be cleaned of all trash, cultivation material and infrastructure (including the unpermitted buildings identified in Appendix B: Map 1 and in Photos 1 & 2).
- Upon removal of all materials within the Project Site, weed free rice straw should be applied to all exposed areas at a rate of 4,000 lbs. per acre.
- All soil from the Smart Pots and consorted raised beds needs to be removed from the Project Site in order to avoid further adding perlite into the surrounding environment.



- Straw wattles should be installed on the slope where the Smart Pots and raised beds are removed from (Photo 8).
 - o For wattle installation, secure the wattles with 18-24 inch stakes every 3-4 ft and with a stake on each end. Stakes should be driven through the middle of the wattle leaving at least 2-3 inches of steak extending above the wattle. Stakes should be driven perpendicular to the slope face.
 - O Downslope spacing should be determined by site conditions such as slope gradient and soil type. However, a good rule-of-thumb for spacing is:
 - 1:1 slopes = 10 ft apart
 - 2:1 slopes = 20 ft apart
 - \blacksquare 3:1 slopes = 30 ft apart, etc.
- This remediation project should be completed within the following water year (October 15, 2021) However, project timeline subject to change contingent on County approval.
- Seeding the site is not required since the Project Site appears to be stable and currently well vegetated. It is likely that the site will become more vegetated over time due to the decommissioning of the site resulting in an avoidance of continual ground disturbance.





Project Description

This conversion proposes to convert timberland into agriculture. Per the Humboldt County General Plan, the conversion exemption area is presently zoned Unclassified with an agricultural general plan designation. Humboldt County's Grading and Open Space Ordinance applies to this project and the County has reviewed and signed off on this project. See attachment from County.

Addendum 14CCR 1104.1(a)(1)(E)(1-4)

The timberland owner has certified via his signature, under penalty of perjury, that this is a one-time conversion to Agriculture. The timberland owner understands that a "Bona Fide Intention or bona fide intent" is a present, sincere intention of the applicant to conform with and successfully execute the conversion plan, as determined by the Director in accordance with provisions of Sec. 1105.2 (Ref.: Sec. 4623, PRC). The timberland owner, acting as an individual, acting as a member of a partnership, or acting as an officer or employee of a corporation or other legal entity, has not obtained an exemption pursuant to this section in the last five years.

Addendum 14CCR 1104.1(a)(2)(F)

There are no watercourses, ELZs, or WLPZs within the conversion exemption area. As shown on the Conversion Exemption Map, a Class II Spring is southeast of the eastern-most conversion site. This spring is an abandoned water site that was developed by the previous owner by drilling into the cutbank of an old skid road. The harvest boundary was flagged a minimum Class II distance from the main source of spring. The dammed portion of Willow Creek is designated a Class I Reservoir although its unknown regarding fish absence or presence. The conversion exemption area is flagged a 150 feet from the reservoir transition line. There was an existing graded flat located west of the conversion area that is partially located within the outer edge of the Class I WLPZ. Please note that this area was already converted prior to submission of this conversion exemption and can be seen from the 2014 NAIP DOQ.

Addendum 14CCR 1104.1(a)(6)

The extent of the vegetation removal and site preparation required for the conversion;

The conversion area consists of merchantable even-aged Douglas-fir and tanoak. Due to the size and density of the timber, extensive harvesting and site preparation are required for the conversion. A chipper will likely be used to treat the slash and non-merchantable trees. Merchantable trees will be processed into logs and hauled to local mills. Stumps will be windrowed at the base of the fillslope. Despite the gentle-moderate topography, significant excavation will be necessary to make the sites useable for their intended use.

The suitability of soils, slope, aspect, and microclimate for the stated non-timber use:

The conversion exemption area's slopes and aspects are favorable for agriculture. The soils are inadequate for agriculture but grow medium is imported and therefore not a limiting factor.

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Addendum 14CCR 1104.1(a)(2)(D) - Treatment of Logging Slash and Woody Debris.

- 1. Unless otherwise required, slash greater than one inch in diameter and greater than two feet long, and woody debris, except pine, shall receive full treatment no later than April 1 of the year following its creation, or within one year from the date of acceptance of the conversion exemption by the Director, whichever comes first.
- 2. All pine slash three inches and greater in diameter and longer than four feet must receive initial treatment if it is still on the parcel, within 7 days of its creation.
- 3. All pine woody debris longer than four feet must receive an initial treatment prior to full treatment.
- 4. Initial treatment shall include limbing woody debris and cutting slash and woody debris into lengths of less than four feet, and leaving the pieces exposed to solar radiation to aid in rapid drying.
- 5. Full treatment of all pine slash and woody debris must be completed by March 1 of the year following its creation, or within one year from the date of acceptance of the conversion exemption by the Director, whichever comes first.
- 6. Full slash and woody debris treatment may include any of the following:
 - a. Burving:
 - b. Chipping and spreading;
 - c. Piling and burning; or
 - d. Removing slash and woody debris from the site for treatment in compliance with (a)-(b). Slash and woody debris may not be burned by open outdoor fires except under permit from the appropriate fire protection agency, if required, the local air pollution control district or air quality management district. The burning must occur on the property where the slash and woody debris originated.
- 7. Slash and woody debris, except for pine, which is cut up for firewood shall be cut to lengths 24 inches or less and set aside for drying by April 1 of the year following its creation. Pine slash and woody debris which is cut up for firewood shall be cut to lengths 24 inches or less and set aside for drying within seven days of its creation.
- 8. Any treatment which involves burning of slash or woody debris shall comply with all state and local fire and air quality rules.

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WINTER OPERATING PLAN

- 1. The erosion hazard rating for the conversion exemption area is moderate.
- Mechanical site preparation is proposed.
- 3. The yarding system for the conversion exemption is ground based.
- 4. This Winter Operating Plan is for all timber operations occurring from October 15 to May 1.
- 5. No watercourses occur the conversion exemption area,
- 6. - 8. Winter Operations Restrictions:

Logging roads, landings or tractor roads shall not be used when visibly turbid water from the road, landing or tractor road (skid trail) or an inside ditch associated with the logging road, landing or tractor road may reach a watercourse or lake in amounts sufficient to cause a turbidity increase in Class I, II, III or IV waters.
 - b. Log hauling on logging roads and landings shall be limited to those which are hydrologically disconnected from watercourses to the extent feasible, and exhibit a stable operating surface.
 - c. Concurrent with use for log hauling, approaches to logging road watercourse crossings shall be treated for erosion control as needed to minimize soil erosion and sediment transport and to prevent the discharge of sediment into watercourses and lakes in quantities deleterious to the beneficial uses of water.
 - d. Concurrent with use for log hauling, all traveled surfaces of logging roads in a WLPZ or within any ELZ or EEZ designated for watercourse or lake protection shall be treated for erosion control as needed to minimize soll erosion and sediment transport and to prevent the discharge of sediment into watercourses and lakes in quantities deleterious to the beneficial uses of water.
 - e. Grading to obtain a drier running surface more than one time before reincorporation of any resulting berms back into the road surface is prohibited.
 - f. Unless the winter period operating plan proposes operations during an extended wet weather period with low antecedent soil wetness, no tractor roads shall be constructed, reconstructed, or used on slopes that are over 40 percent and within 200 feet of a Class I, II, or III watercourse, as measured from the watercourse or lake transition line during the extended wet weather period.
 - g. Logging roads, landings and tractor roads shall not be used when sediment from the logging road, landing or tractor road surface is transported to a watercourse or a drainage facility that discharges into a watercourse in amounts sufficient to cause a visible increase in turbidity in Class I, II, III, or IV waters.
 - h. Logging roads and landings shall not be used for log hauling when saturated soil conditions result in the visible increase in turbidity specified in Class I, II, III, or IV waters.

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
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


- i. SATURATED SOIL CONDITIONS: means that soil and/or surface material pore spaces are filled with water to such an extent that runoff is likely to occur. Indicators of saturated soil conditions may include, but are not limited to: (1) areas of ponded water, (2) pumping of fines from the soil or road surfacing material during timber operations, (3) loss of bearing strength resulting in the deflection of soil or road surfaces under a load, such as the creation of wheel ruts, (4) spinning or churning of wheels or tracks that produces a wet slurry, or (5) inadequate traction without blading wet soil or surfacing materials.
