To Plaintiffs and Others Filing First Papers. If you are filing a first paper (for example, a complaint) in a civil case, you must complete and file, along with your first paper, the Civil Case Cover Sheet contained on page 1. This information will be used to compile statistics about the types and numbers of cases filed. You must complete items 1 through 6 on the sheet. In item 1, you must check one box for the case type that best describes the case. If the case fits both a general and a more specific type of case listed in item 1, check the more specific one. If the case has multiple causes of action, check the box that best indicates the primary cause of action. To assist you in completing the sheet, examples of the cases that belong under each case type in item 1 are provided below. A cover sheet must be filed only with your initial paper. Failure to file a cover sheet with the first paper filed in a civil case may subject a party, its counsel, or both to sanctions under rules 2.30 and 3.220 of the California Rules of Court.

To Parties in Rule 3.740 Collections Cases. Proc., § 1085] AUDITOR-CONTROLLER FOR THE COUNTY OF HUMBOLDT, AND COUNTY OF HUMBOLDT, 20 Defendants. 21 Plaintiffs, the People of the State of California and California State Controller Betty T. Yee, 22 23 file this Complaint and Petition, and complain and allege as follows. Code of Civil Procedure section 446, subdivision (a) requires any answer to this Complaint and Petition to be verified. 24 25 INTRODUCTION 1. This is an action brought by the People of the State of California (People) and State 26 Controller Betty T. Yee (Controller) (collectively, plaintiffs) seeking monetary forfeitures for 27

defendant Karen Paz Dominguez's (Paz Dominguez) failure to timely file copies of County of

Humboldt's (County) adopted budgets by December 1, 2020, and December 1, 2021, in violation of Government Code section 29093, and failure to timely file her Financial Transactions Reports (FTR) for fiscal years 2019/2020 and 2020/2021, in violation of Government Code section 53891.

- 2. As County's Auditor-Controller, Paz Dominguez is required to file a copy of County's adopted budget in the State Controller's Office (SCO) not later than December 1 of each year. Failure to timely file the adopted budget subjects County to a forfeiture in the amount of \$1,000.00, for each year that the adopted budget is not filed by the statutory deadline. (Gov. Code, § 29093, subds. (a) and (b).)
- 3. As County's Auditor-Controller, Paz Dominguez is also required to file an FTR with SCO within seven months of the close of County's fiscal year on June 30. Failure to file the FTR by the statutory deadline subjects Paz Dominguez to forfeitures in the amount of \$5,000.00, for each year that the FTR is not filed in the time, form, and manner prescribed by the State Controller. (Gov. Code, §§ 12464, subd. (a), 53891, subd. (a) and 53895, subd. (a)(3).)
- 4. Paz Dominguez failed to timely file County's adopted budgets that were due on December 1, 2020, and December 1, 2021, and failed to timely file her FTRs for fiscal years 2019/2020 and 2020/2021 with the SCO in the time, form, and manner prescribed by the State Controller.
- 5. Plaintiffs seek an order for payment of forfeitures as set out in Government Code sections 29093 and 53895.
- 6. Plaintiffs also seek a writ under Code of Civil Procedure section 1085 compelling Paz Dominguez to perform her ministerial duties under Government Code sections 29093 and 53891, et seq., in the time, form, and manner prescribed by the State Controller.

#### **PARTIES**

- 7. Plaintiffs are the People of the State of California and California State Controller Betty T. Yee.
- 8. Attorney General Rob Bonta is the Attorney General of the State of California and has the primary responsibility of serving as legal counsel for the People, state officers, and state agencies.

- 9. State Controller Betty T. Yee superintends the state's fiscal concerns, and keeps the public informed of financial transactions of city, county, and district governments.
- 10. Defendant Paz Dominguez is sued in her personal capacity and in her official capacity as the Auditor-Controller for County. She is an elected county official, has charge of County's financial records, and is responsible under Government Code sections 29093 and 53891, et seq., to ensure that County's adopted budgets and her FTRs are filed in the time, form, and manner required by the State Controller.
- 11. Defendant County of Humboldt is an administrative and political subdivision of California that exercises some level of governmental authority over a geographic region with specific boundaries.

#### JURISDICTION AND VENUE

12. At all times relevant, Paz Dominguez transacted business in the County of Humboldt. The violations of law described in this Complaint and Petition were, and are now, being carried out in the County of Humboldt. This Court has jurisdiction under Article VI, section 10, of the California Constitution, and sections 393 and 395 of the Code of Civil Procedure.

# FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION Failure To Comply With Adopted Budget Reporting Requirement (Government Code section 29093) (Against defendants Paz Dominguez and County of Humboldt)

- 13. Plaintiffs re-allege and incorporate by reference each of the allegations of paragraphs 1 through 12 of this Complaint.
- 14. Under Government Code section 29093, subdivision (a), a copy of County's adopted budget "shall be filed by the auditor in the office of the clerk of the board and the office of the Controller not later than December 1 of each year."
  - 15. Government Code section 29093, subdivision (b) sets out that:

If the auditor, after receipt of written notice from the Controller, fails to transmit a copy of the adopted budget within 20 days, the county shall forfeit to the state one thousand dollars (\$1,000) to be recovered in an action brought by the Attorney General, in the name of the Controller.

16. On February 28, 2022, the SCO sent a letter to Paz Dominguez advising that

County's adopted budget for 2020/2021 was not received by the December 1, 2020 due date. The letter warned that County would be subject to a \$1,000.00 forfeiture if Paz Dominguez failed to file the missing budget by March 21, 2022.

- 17. On February 28, 2022, the SCO sent a letter to Paz Dominguez advising that County's adopted budget for 2021/2022 was not received by the December 1, 2021 due date. The letter warned that County would be subject to a \$1,000.00 forfeiture if Paz Dominguez failed to file the missing budget by March 21, 2022.
- 18. On March 21, 2022, the SCO received incomplete budget schedules for County's fiscal years 2020/2021 and 2021/2022. Both sets of schedules were missing information required by Government Code section 29006, including but not limited to: Appropriations Limit and Total Annual Appropriations Subject to Limitation, and the fiscal year 2021/2022 schedules were missing Beginning Fund Balances. Additionally, the schedules for both fiscal years did not meet the requirement under Government Code section 29009 that funding sources equal financing uses. SCO rejected the incomplete schedules.
- 19. Paz Dominguez failed to file adopted budgets for fiscal years 2020/2021 and 2021/2022 that comply with statutory requirements by the March 21, 2022 deadline set out in SCO's February 28, 2022 letters, nor have they been filed since then.
- 20. The State Controller now seeks an order requiring County to pay the forfeitures provided in Government Code section 29093, subdivision (b).

#### SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION

Failing To Comply With Financial Transactions Reporting Requirement (Government Code section 53891, et seq.)
(Against defendant Paz Dominquez)

- 21. Plaintiffs re-allege and incorporate by reference each of the allegations of paragraphs 1 through 12 of this Complaint.
  - 22. Government Code section 53891, subdivision (a) states in relevant part:

The officer of each local agency who has charge of the financial records shall furnish to the Controller a report of all the financial transactions of the local agency during the preceding fiscal year. The report shall contain underlying data from audited financial statements prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, if this data is available. The report shall be furnished within seven months after the close of each

fiscal year or within the time prescribed by the Controller, whichever is later, and shall be in the form and manner required by the Controller.

- 23. Government Code section 53895 states in relevant part:
- (a) An officer of a local agency who fails or refuses to make and file his or her report within 20 days after receipt of a written notice of the failure from the Controller shall forfeit to the state:
- (3) Five thousand dollars (\$5,000) in the case of a local agency with total revenue, in the prior year, of at least two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000), as reported in the Controller's annual financial reports.
- (b)(1) Upon the request of the Controller, the Attorney General shall prosecute an action for the forfeiture in the name of the people of the State of California.

#### The 2019/2020 FTR

- County Auditor-Controller, reminding her of her responsibility to file her 2019/2020 FTR by the February 1, 2021 due date. The letter also included instructions for the submission of the FTR.
- 25. On February 26, 2021, the SCO sent a letter to Paz Dominguez, in her capacity as County Auditor-Controller, advising that her FTR for 2019/2020 was delinquent, and providing 20 additional days to comply. The letter warned of a forfeiture up to \$5,000.00, if Paz Dominguez failed to file her report by March 18, 2021. Paz Dominguez did not file her 2019/2020 FTR by the March 18, 2021 deadline, and from that time forward, has been subject to the forfeiture provisions of Government Code section 53895.
- 26. On June 1, 2021, the SCO sent an email to Paz Dominguez following up on the February 26, 2021 letter. Paz Dominguez responded on June 14, 2021, stating that the County's audit for fiscal year 2019/2020 was underway, but not yet complete. Paz Dominguez offered to complete the report using unaudited information and indicated it would take two weeks. The SCO said that it would accept the report with unaudited data in the agreed upon two-week timeframe. On June 21, 2021, Paz Dominguez represented to the SCO that "[w]e exported our data from Finance Enterprise and are sorting it following some paperwork from last year" and

that "[w]e are all on high alert that this is an urgent priority." Paz Dominguez did not file her 2019/2020 FTR by the two-week deadline.

- 27. Nearly nine months later, on February 24, 2022, the Attorney General's Office sent a Final Demand letter to Paz Dominguez giving her 20 days to file her 2019/2020 FTR.
- 28. On March 16, 2022, Paz Dominguez submitted her FTR with unaudited data, and falsely stated that it was prepared by the "AG", and "Under the Direction of the AG."
- 29. On March 21, 2022, the SCO returned the 2019/2020 FTR to Paz Dominguez along with an email that said, in relevant part:

We received the financial transactions data for Humboldt County's 2019-20 Financial Transactions Report submitted by your office. So far, we have identified some items requiring immediate revision, and therefore have returned the report. The General Information page, under 'Report Prepared By' requires the first name, last name, and title of the person who input the data but instead reads "Under the Direction of the AG", "N/A", and "AG", respectively. Please log into the LGRS Online system using the account and password previously provided and input an accurate first and last name and title of the report preparer and resubmit by clicking "Submit Data" right away, but no later than close of business, Wednesday, March 23, 2022.

- 30. Paz Dominguez did not respond to the SCO's email and did not correct her FTR.
- 31. FTRs must be filed in the time, form, and manner required by the State Controller. (Gov. Code, §§ 12464, subd. (a) and 53891, subd. (a).) By failing to make and file her 2019/2020 FTR within 20 days after receipt of a written notice of the failure from the Controller, and by refusing to disclose the name of the person who prepared her 2019/2020 FTR, Paz Dominguez failed or refused to file her report in the time, form, and manner required by the State Controller, and failed to file her report by the demand date set out in the SCO's March 21, 2022 email.
- 32. Use of unaudited data is allowed if audited data is not available, to enable timely filing of an FTR. (Gov. Code, § 53891, subd. (a).) Paz Dominguez's FTR for 2019/2020 is more than a year overdue. Submission of the deficient 2019/2020 FTR on March 16, 2022, is inexcusable and does not satisfy Paz Dominguez's statutory obligation.
- 33. Paz Dominguez failed to file her 2019/2020 FTR in the time, form, and manner required by the State Controller, and she is subject to a forfeiture in the amount of \$5,000.00, under Government Code section 53895, subdivision (a)(3).

#### The 2020/2021 FTR

- 34. On November 5, 2021, the SCO sent a letter to Paz Dominguez, in her capacity as County Auditor-Controller, reminding her of her responsibility to file her 2020/2021 FTR by the January 31, 2022 due date. The letter also included instructions for submission of the FTR.
  - 35. Paz Dominguez did not file her 2020/2021 FTR by the January 31, 2022 deadline.
- 36. On February 25, 2022, the SCO sent a letter to Paz Dominguez, in her capacity as County Auditor-Controller, advising that her FTR for 2020/2021 was delinquent and providing 20 additional days to comply. The letter warned that failure to file her report by March 17, 2022, would result in a forfeiture of up to \$5,000. Paz Dominguez did not file her 2020/2021 FTR by the March 17, 2022 deadline, nor has she filed it since then.
- 37. Paz Dominguez failed to file her 2020/2021 FTR within 20 days of the Controller's February 25, 2022 delinquency letter, and she is subject to a forfeiture in the amount of \$5,000.00, under Government Code section 53895, subdivision (a)(3).

### THIRD CAUSE OF ACTION

Mandamus Relief (Code of Civil Procedure section 1085, et seq.) (Against defendant Paz Dominguez)

- 38. Plaintiffs re-allege and incorporate by reference each of the allegations of paragraphs 1 through 37 of this Complaint.
- 39. The Court is authorized to issue a writ of mandate to compel an officeholder to perform an act that the law specifically commands as a duty resulting from the office. (Code Civ. Proc., § 1085, subd. (a).)
- 40. The writ must be issued in all cases where there is not a plain, speedy, and adequate remedy, in the ordinary course of law. It must be issued upon the verified petition of the party beneficially interested. (Code Civ. Proc., § 1086.)
- 41. Government Code section 29093, subdivision (a) creates a mandatory duty for Paz Dominguez, as the Auditor-Controller for County, to file a copy of County's adopted budget in the office of the Controller not later than December 1 of each year.
  - 42. Government Code 53891, subdivision (a) creates a mandatory duty for Paz

Dominguez, as the Auditor-Controller for County, to furnish to the Controller a report of all of County's financial transactions during the preceding fiscal year within seven months of County's fiscal year-end.

- 43. Plaintiffs lack a plain, speedy, and adequate remedy at law.
- 44. Plaintiffs are entitled to issuance of a writ of mandate compelling Paz Dominguez to perform her mandatory statutory duties.

#### RELIEF REQUESTED

WHEREFORE, plaintiffs pray for judgment as follows:

- 1. For an order requiring County to pay a forfeiture in the amount of \$1,000.00, for Paz Dominguez's failure to timely file County's adopted 2020/2021 budget in violation of Government Code section 29093.
- 2. For an order requiring County to pay a forfeiture in the amount of \$1,000.00, for Paz Dominguez's failure to timely file County's adopted 2021/2022 budget in violation of Government Code section 29093.
- 3. For an order requiring Paz Dominguez to pay a forfeiture in the amount of \$5,000.00, for her failure to timely file her FTR for fiscal year 2019/2020 in the time, form, and manner required by the State Controller, in violation of Government Code sections 12464, subdivision (a), and 53891, et seq.
- 4. For an order requiring Paz Dominguez to pay a forfeiture in the amount of \$5,000.00, for her failure to timely file her FTR for fiscal year 2020/2021 in the time, form, and manner required by the State Controller, in violation of Government Code sections 12464, subdivision (a), and 53891, et seq.
- 5. For issuance of a writ under Code of Civil Procedure sections 1085 and 1086 requiring Paz Dominguez to perform her mandatory statutory duties under Government Code sections 29093 and 53891, et seq., in the time, form, and manner required by the State Controller.
- 6. For issuance of a writ under Code of Civil Procedure sections 1085 and 1086 requiring Paz Dominguez to correct the 2019/2020 FTR to include the name of the person who prepared the report.
