#### DISCUSSION:

In partnership with the Eureka Police Department (EPD), the Department of Health and Human Services – Mental Health (DHHS-MH) will increase outreach, assessment and treatment to homeless severely mentally ill individuals coming to the attention of law enforcement. EPD and DHHS-MH will develop protocols, case reviews, treatment referrals and communication structures to ensure that appropriate

responses and services are provided within available resources. With an earlier and integrated team response, the intent is that those individuals will receive pertinent care treatment with the goal of avoiding further law enforcement intervention and psychiatric hospitalizations.

A joint EPD and DHHS response will be provided to an individual with suspected severe mental illness. The Clinician will be able to assess the individual in the field as well as transition the client, when necessary to Crisis Stabilization (CSU) or Sempervirens (SV). Upon release from CSU/SV the Clinician and Case Manager will establish a holistic discharge plan addressing the needs and follow up care that is required.

The EPD/DHHS - MH Team will review clients with high usage of LE response and identify gaps and needs for appropriate resources or treatment. Treatment plans will be developed to include behavior health services, housing, eligibility and food.

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Salary and benefit cost of the mental health staffing to support Community Mobile Response Team is \$101,718 for 1.0 FTE Mental Health Clinician I/II and \$72,810 for 1.0 FTE Mental Health Case Manager. Revenue to support these expenditures is available thru Short-Doyle Medi-Cal federal financial participation, Mental Health Services Act, and Realignment. Salary savings due to current vacancies will offset this expenditure, so a supplemental budget is not requested at this time.

Approving the requested position allocations supports the Board's Strategic Framework by protecting vulnerable populations and creating opportunities for improved health and safety.
