Multi-Agency Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council Appointments

<u>RECOMMENDATION(S)</u>: That the Board of Supervisors approve the updated roster and appointments to the Multi-Agency Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council.

SOURCE OF FUNDING: N/A

<u>DISCUSSION</u>: Passage of SB 1760 created the opportunity for Humboldt County to participate in the application for funding within the newly created Juvenile Offender Accountability Challenge Grant Program. Pursuant to Welfare and Institution Code Section 749.2-749.27, to be eligible for this grant funding, each county was required to establish a Multi-Agency Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council that developed and implemented a continuum of county-based responses to juvenile crime.

The Coordinating Council's membership needed to include, at a minimum, the Chief Probation Officer, as Chair, one representative each from the District Attorney's Office, the Public Defender's Office, the Sheriff's Department, the Board of Supervisors, the Department of Social Services, the Department of Mental Health, a Community-based Drug and Alcohol Program, a City Police Department, the County Office of Education or School District, and an At-Large community representative.

As the appointing authority for the Multi-Agency Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council, the Board of Supervisors is being asked to approve the appointment of Abby Abinanti as the Criminal Justice – Tribal Court representative following the resignation of Merris Obie, the appointment of Stephen Watson, Police Captain as the Criminal Justice – Law Enforcement representative (replacing EPD Chief Andy Mills) and the appointment of Jason Sheets, Criminal Justice – District Attorney representative (replacing DA Maggie Fleming) and the attached updated roster to the Multi-Agency Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council.
