<u>DISCUSSION</u>: On August 10, 2015 the Ferndale City Council unanimously passed Resolutions # 2015-24, #2015-25, # 2015-26, and #2015-27 requesting the Board of Supervisors approve the consolidation of their General Municipal Election with Humboldt County's General Election to be held on November 3, 2015, and calling for submission to the electorate for consideration a ballot measure question relating to the Transient Occupancy Tax (TOT).

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** by the City Council of the City of Ferndale that the County of Humboldt is requested to hold a consolidated election to present voters with a question regarding Transient Occupancy Tax.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FERNDALE CALLING AND GIVING NOTICE OF THE HOLDING OF A GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 3, 2015, FOR THE SUBMISSION TO THE VOTERS A BALLOT MEASURE QUESTION RELATING TO THE TRANSIENT OCCUPANCY TAX.

**WHEREAS**, under the provisions of the General Law of the City of Ferndale and of the Elections Code of the State of California, a General Municipal Election shall be held on Tuesday, November 3, 2015; and

WHEREAS, the Ferndale City Council desires to submit to the voters a question relating to amendment of pertinent sections of the Ferndale Municipal Code pertaining to the Transient Occupancy Tax; and

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FERNDALE, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That pursuant to the requirements of the General Law of the City of Ferndale and the Election Code of the State of California, there is called and ordered to be held in the City of Ferndale, California, on Tuesday, November 3, 2015 a General Municipal Election for the purpose of submitting to the voters a ballot measure relating to the Transient Occupancy Tax.

SECTION 2. That the City Council, pursuant to its right and authority, does order submitted to the voters at the General Municipal Election the following question:

Shall the Ferndale Municipal Code be amended to increase the currently assessed eight percent (8%) Transient Occupancy Tax to ten percent (10%) to	YES	
fund essential services such as police, fire, street maintenance, environmental programs, and parks and recreation?	NO	

SECTION 3. That the proposed complete text of the Ordinance submitted to the voters is attached as Exhibit A.

SECTION 4. That the ballots to be used at the election shall be in form and content as required by law.

SECTION 5. That the polls for the election shall be open at seven o'clock A.M. of the day of the election and shall remain open continuously from that time until eight o'clock P.M. if the same day when the polls shall be closed, pursuant to Elections Code 10242, except as provided in 14401 of the Elections Code of the State of California.

SECTION 6. That in all particulars not recited in this resolution, the election shall be held and conducted as provided by law for holding municipal elections.

SECTION 7. That notice of the time and place of holding the election is given and the City Clerk is authorized, instructed and directed to give further or additional notice of the election, in time, form and manner as required by law.

SECTION~8. That the City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution and enter it into the book of original Resolutions.

# RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FERNDALE SETTING PRIORITIES FOR FILING WRITTEN ARGUMENTS REGARDING A CITY BALLOT MEASURE AND DIRECTING THE CITY ATTORNEY TO PREPARE AN IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS.

WHEREAS, a General Municipal Election is to be held in the City of Ferndale, California, on November 3, 2015, at which there will be submitted to the voters the following ballot measure question:

Shall the Ferndale Municipal Code be amended to increase the currently assessed eight percent	YES	
(8%) Transient Occupancy Tax to ten percent (10%) to fund essential services such as police,		
fire, street maintenance, environmental programs, and parks and recreation?	NO	

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FERNDALE, CALIFORNIA, DOES RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That the City Council authorizes all members of the City Council to file a written argument in favor of the City measure as specified above, accompanied by the printed name(s) and signature(s) of the author(s) submitting it, in accordance with Article 4, Chapter 3, Division 9 of the Elections Code of the State of California, and to change the argument until and including the date fixed by the City Clerk after which no arguments for or against the City measure may be submitted to the City Clerk.

Arguments shall be filed with the City Clerk, signed, with the printed name(s) and signature(s) of the author(s) submitting it, or if submitted on behalf of an organization, the name of the organization, and the printed name and signature of at least one of its principal officers who is the author of the argument. The arguments shall be accompanied by the Form of Statement To Be Filed By Author(s) of Argument (Attachment A).

SECTION 2. That the City Council directs the City Clerk to transmit a copy of the measure to the City Attorney, unless the organization or salaries of the office of the City Attorney are affected. The City Attorney shall prepare an impartial analysis of the measure showing the effect of the measure on the existing law and the operation of the measure. If the measure affects the organization or salaries of the office of the City Attorney, the City Clerk shall prepare the impartial analysis. The impartial analysis shall be filed by the date set by the City Clerk for the filing of primary arguments.

SECTION 3. That the City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this resolution and enter it into the book of original resolutions.

## RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FERNDALE, CALIFORNIA PROVIDING FOR THE FILING OF REBUTTAL ARGUMENTS FOR CITY MEASURES SUBMITTED AT MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS.

WHEREAS, Sections 9220 and 9285 of the Elections Code of the State of California authorize the City Council, by majority vote, to adopt provisions to provide for the filing of rebuttal arguments for City measures submitted at municipal elections;

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FERNDALE, CALIFORNIA, DOES RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That pursuant to Sections 9220 and 9285 of the Elections Code of the State of California, when the elections official has selected the arguments for and against the measure which will be printed and distributed to the voters, the elections official shall send a copy of the argument in favor of the measure to the authors of any argument against the measure, and a copy of the argument against the measure to the authors of any argument in favor of the measure immediately upon receiving the arguments.

The author or a majority of the authors of an argument relating to a city measure may prepare and submit a rebuttal argument not exceeding 250 words, or may authorize in writing any other person or persons to prepare, submit, or sign the rebuttal argument.

A rebuttal argument may not be signed by more than five persons.

The rebuttal arguments shall be filed with the City Clerk, signed, with the printed name(s) and signature(s) of the author(s) submitting it, or if submitted on behalf of an organization, the name of the organization, and the printed name and signature of at least one of its principal officers, not more than 10 days after the final date for filing direct arguments.

The rebuttal arguments shall be accompanied by the Form of Statement To Be Filed By Authors(s) of Argument (Attachment A).

Rebuttal arguments shall be printed in the same manner as the direct arguments. Each rebuttal argument shall immediately follow the direct argument which it seeks to rebut.

<u>SECTION 2</u>. That all previous resolutions providing for the filing of rebuttal arguments for City measures are repealed.

<u>SECTION 3</u>. That the provisions of Section 1, shall apply at the next ensuing municipal election and at each municipal election after that time.

<u>SECTION 4</u>. That the City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution and enter it into the book of original Resolutions.
