Dear Chairman Bosco:

I am writing on behalf of the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors to express our enthusiastic support for the City of Arcata's California State Coastal Conservancy (SCC) grant application for construction of the Humboldt Bay Trail North (HBTN). This Class I non-motorized multi-use trail is a long-awaited asset in the community. It has been developed with extensive community input, and the trail system has been identified as the highest priority transportation enhancement project.

The HBTN will provide safe, enjoyable non-motorized commuter and recreational coastal access for bicyclists, walkers and hikers, runners, skaters, wildlife viewers, nature educators, and other non-motorized outdoor users. It will be a portion of the larger trail network that creates a safe commuter route between the County's two largest cities, Arcata and Eureka where currently nonmotorized travel must be done on a four-lane State highway. It will also provide access to a portion of the Humboldt Bay and Humboldt Bay National Wildlife Refuge that is currently inaccessible, and will serve as a major link for the California Coastal Trail, a 1,200 mile long state trail project created by the California State Legislature that is nearly half completed, at present.

The City of Arcata has completed the design of the HBTN and has secured \$4.4 million for trail construction. Because the project is "construction-ready" and nearly fully funded, this State Coastal Conservancy grant will play a critical role in the realization of this community goal.
