Dear Ms. Spradley-Kurowski:

On behalf of the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors, I am writing in support of the Humboldt Bay Maritime Museum's application for funds through the National Maritime Heritage Act to restore the historic fishing vessel Stephanie. The Humboldt Bay Maritime Museum is well-known locally for its restoration and preservation of the wooden motor vessel Madaket. The motor vessel Madaket provides historical, current day and ecological information and education to over 16,000 people a year.

The Humboldt Bay Maritime Museum is a great supporter of our local community and youth. They provide reduce rates to schools, non-profits, participate in the "Get out and Play Day" for the city of Eureka, (where kids ride free) donations of tickets for Madaket and participate in every community event on the bay. The Madaket is also the corner stone for tourism on Humboldt Bay.

The fishing vessel Stephanie was built in 1917 and is a wooden pair trawler that fished out of San Francisco until 1941 when she was brought to Humboldt Bay by the famous Lazio Fish Company, located in Eureka, CA. Stephanie was the 61st commercial registered fishing vessel in California and was the oldest drag vessel in service until her retirement in 2003. The vessel's retirement was due to the owners opting into the federal Pacific Coast Groundfish Buyback program, which permanently removed its fishing permits making the vessel unable to fish. In 2011, the Humboldt Bay Maritime Museum started took ownership of the Stephanie and started her restoration process. The Stephanie will provide historical and ecological opportunities that are not currently available in our local community.

The Stephanie is an important piece of maritime history to not only our local community but to the country. She is reminder of the fishing practices of yesterday, the need of sustainability today and should be restored for future generations.

Please give the Humboldt Bay Maritime Museum's funding request your full consideration.
