DISCUSSION:

As part of the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office, the Animal Control Division is responsible for the functions of animal regulatory enforcement, and for the shelter and care of stray animals for the county. This division is responsible for the operation of the county's 14,000 square foot Animal Shelter. Over 1,500 animals are brought into the shelter annually and over 16,000 animals are licensed each year. Costs of shelter and Animal Control operations are offset by a number of revenue streams, including payments from contract cities and state parks within Humboldt County. Due to an overpopulation of unwanted dogs and cats in Humboldt County, division staff also works closely with local animal welfare organizations to increase spaying and neutering of animals.

The Animal Shelter contracts with local veterinary doctors to provide spay and neuter services, as well as other medical requirements for shelter animals. Due to an unexpectedly high number of dogs and cats requiring these services, the amounts budgeted for Professional Services and Special Department Expense in the FY2015-16 has proven to be inadequate. Expenses for the fiscal year have exceeded budget projections in these two categories by a combined total of approximately 44% and necessitate an adjustment to the Animal Shelter budget to meet all obligations for FY2015-16.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

A supplemental budget adjustment in the amount of \$35,000 is requested to cover the anticipated final expenses in line item 1100-278-2118 Professional Services for veterinary services and line item 1100-278-2123 Special Department Expense for food, medicine and other supplies. The Animal Shelter is able to cover costs for the additional expenses through fees and donations that are held in the Spay and Neuter Trust 3650. Adjusted budget amounts are shown below:

Trust fund 3650 balance as of June 30, 2016 is \$129,554. Upon approval the remaining fund balance will be \$55,327. No additional funds from the County General Fund will be needed.

The supplemental budget adjustment meets the Board of Supervisors Strategic Framework Plan goal of providing community-appropriate levels of service and maximizing the use of financial resources.

ALTERNATIVES TO STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

The Board could deny the request to approve the supplemental budget adjustment #1, however, this is not recommended as Budget Unit 278 for the Animal Shelter would be overdrawn and unable to meet obligations to close FY2015-16.
